### Abies alba 'Green Spiral'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Large 25'h x 15'w Green 👄

'Green Spiral' has dark green, glossy needles, on twisting stems that spiral outward and down. Deep green, stylish habit and moderate size make this an excellent focal point.

### Abies alba 'Pyramidalis'

Narrow Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 10'h x 5'w Green 🤝

This outstanding garden plant has a dense, formal, conical shape. Dark green needles have complementary silver-gray undersides. In cultivation since 1851.

### Abies amabilis 'Spreading Star'

Spreading Zone 5 Dwarf 3'h x 6'w Green 🔘

'Spreading Star' is a beautiful low-growing spreader with thick stems. Long, dark green needles radiate upward from the stem edge to give this plant a full, lush texture. Occasional pruning will maintain its prostrate form. Found in Holland in 1965.

### **ABIES**

The genus Abies, the true fir, offers beautiful, adaptable garden forms that exhibit exceptional uniformity and regular branching. Valued for a wide range of striking evergreen shapes and sizes that fill many landscape needs, Abies cultivars include broad and narrow upright trees, naturally low, prostrate forms, tiny varieties for use in rock gardens and troughs, and weeping forms that make outstanding focal points. Stiff, pointed needles, some of which recurve to show off silvery undersides, contribute rich colors and tight textures to garden scenes. Upright ornamental cones boast bright colors too. Most Abies prefer rich soil with abundant rainfall and are highly adaptable and easy to maintain when given good drainage. Hardiness varies by species.

#### Abies balsamea 'Piccolo'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 2'h x2'w Green 🗭

Tiny, uniform, dark green needles radiate around the many short branches of this dwarf balsam fir. Smaller and finer than 'Nana,' the improved selection displays prominent brown buds for seasonal interest. The dense, very dwarf globe is ideal for rock gardens, containers and small landscapes. Found and introduced by Edwin Carstens Nursery, Varel, Germany.

### Abies balsamea 'Tyler Blue'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Large 25'h x 15'w Blue 🗭

Blue and beautiful are the two best words to describe this plant. The distinctive blue foliage stands out in the landscape where this pyramidal tree commands attention. The lush needles are soft to the touch, typical of other balsam firs. It is a fairly compact grower that prefers well-drained soil. It enjoys full sun but will maintain its attractive blue color in part shade.

#### Abies koreana 'Aurea'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Large 20'h x 15'w Yellow

Lemon yellow needles with glowing, silver white undersides are displayed on the ascending branches of this outstanding specimen in spring. The yellow gradually softens as the season progresses, but complementary purple-blue cones add to the dramatic effect. Full sun produces the best color, but plants benefit from some protection if grown in scorching conditions. Over time, with staking, 'Aurea' becomes a large, pyramidal tree.

#### Abies koreana 'Blauer Eskimo'

Globe Shaped Zone 4 Miniature 1'h x 1'w Bluish Green 👄

An unusual shade of gray-green needles provide the back drop for the plentiful resin covered buds on this dwarf Korean fir. The flat needles are spirally arranged on short, light colored shoots forming a uniform, tight, globe-shaped plant. An excellent rock garden addition that enjoys full sun and moist well-drained soil. Found as a witch's broom in Germany, 1984.

#### Abies koreana 'Cis'

Globe Shaped Zone 4 Dwarf 1½'h x 2'w Green 👄

Radiating, dark green needles lie flat on the stems and provide a backdrop for attractive, small, brown buds at the branch tips. This flattened, spherical plant has a formal, tidy appearance and glistening foliage that draws attention in the garden. Selected in Holland in 1989.

#### Abies koreana 'Golden Glow'

Spreading Zone 4 Intermediate 6'h x 12'w Yellow 🤝

Especially in winter, this striking Korean fir lives up to its name. Many shoots loaded with short, wide needles—light yellow with white reverses—brighten the scene with both color and texture. The compact, mid-size selection from Holland develops an irregular, spreading shape, and in late winter, buds with a purple cast add decoration. Provide moist, well-drained soil and some protection from scorching sun in hot areas.

#### Abies koreana 'Ice Breaker'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 3'w Silver

'Ice Breaker' became an overnight sensation after its discovery as a mutation growing on *Abies koreana* 'Horstmann's Silberlocke' and is sought for its stunning contribution to the garden! Two-toned needles recurve up and around their stems to expose a bright white, waxy underside of the green needle. Slow growing with a rounded form when young, it may eventually mature into a broadly pyramidal small tree. This spectacular, colorful dwarf won the distinction of the American Conifer Society's 2014 Conifer of the Year.

### Abies koreana 'Silberperle'

Globe Shaped Zone 4 Miniature 1½'h x 1½'w Green 🗭

This tiny Korean fir is an exquisite garden gem, with every compact branch decorated with pearls—really resinous, white buds—during fall and winter. Short, wide, deep green needles, accented with silvery white undersides, add to the plant's year-round ornamental impact. Conifer collectors and other discerning gardeners will love adding this dense, very slow growing jewel to their rock or trough displays, where it eventually takes on a pyramidal form. Use caution in hot areas, where harsh rays can bleach the needles. *Limited Availability* 

#### Abies koreana 'Silver Show'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Large 12'h x 8'w Silver 🔘

The two-toned needles of 'Silver Show' are so tightly curled that the shoots are almost cylindrical, exposing the extremely white undersides completely. The result is a silver-white element in the garden. The contrasting dark purple cones stand out against the foliage. Showy color and special texture abound. Enjoys full sun and moist, well-drained soil.

#### Abies koreana 'Starker's Dwarf'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 2'h x 3'w Green

This dwarf cultivar of the Korean fir starts out with a nest form when young and develops a mounded shape with age. Its wide, blunt-tipped needles, decorated with white undersides, present a striking texture. Protect from hot, direct afternoon sun.

#### Abies koreana 'Wellenseind'

Globe Shaped Zone 4 Miniature 1 ½'h x 1 ½'w Green 🤝

Abies koreana 'Wellenseind' is a extremely compact, slow-growing conifer with short, wide, dark green needles that are held at wide angles. It boasts conspicuous white buds in winter. An excellent choice for containers or in the alpine rock garden, this delightful selection is sure to please. Originated as a witch's broom in The Netherlands.

#### Abies nordmanniana 'Arne's Dwarf'

Narrow Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 8'h x 2'w Green 👄

A most attractive dwarf presentation of the lovely Nordmann fir. Dark green, blunt tipped, short needles have the characteristic two white stripes on the undersides. Radially held, the needles reflect a bit of frosting to the overall look of the plant. Short shoots emerge upward, flattening with age to create a very dense round tree that fills in over time. Native to the Caucasus Mountains, Nordmann fir thrive in moist, well-drained, acid soils.

### Abies nordmanniana 'Golden Spreader'

Spreading Zone 5 Dwarf 3'h x 6'w Yellow

The bright, golden yellow of this low, spreading fir is especially striking in winter when much of the garden's color has faded. During the rest of the year, the versatile, useful plant brightens areas of partial shade, which it appreciates.

#### Abies nordmanniana 'Pendula'

Weeping Zone 5 Large 25'h x 15'w Green 🔾

Distinctive, dark green, soft, blunt-tipped needles cover long, pendulous branches which reach out and fall to the ground. Young trees are staked for height. As the trees mature, they take on great character as the gently swerving main trunk and irregular arrangements of weeping branches work together to create a unique garden sculpture. *Limited Availability* 

### New Abies pinsapo 'Fastigiata'

Narrow Upright Zone 7 Large 25'h x 12'w Green 🔾

A columnar form of Spanish fir with branches that grow sharply upward. Characteristic of the species, the short, stout, blue-green needles are arranged radially around the branches making for a dense and interesting appearance. The Spanish fir is more tolerant of hot dry conditions than other fir species as it is native to dry mountain areas in southern Spain. Plant in well-drained soil. Will tolerate shade but does best in full sun. *Limited Availability* 

### New Abies pinsapo 'Pendula'

Weeping Zone 7 Size defined by culture Green O

The stems of this weeping form of Spanish fir are covered in thick, sharply pointed blue green needles arranged with the species' characteristic oh-so-satisfying spiral symmetry. Red pollen cones glow at branch tips in spring. The trunk can be staked if an upright tree form is desired, or the cascading branches can be allowed to ramble down a rock wall or slope. *Abies pinsapo* prefer well-draining neutral to slightly alkaline soil and full sun. 'Pendula' is a unique evergreen addition to the drought tolerant Mediterranean garden. *Limited Availability*

### New Abies procera 'DelBar Cascade'

Weeping Zone 5 Intermediate 10'h x 2'w Green O

A weeping form of Noble fir, this selection has blue-green needles that cover the strictly pendulous branches. Requiring staking to get it started, it will soon become an upright grower with branches held tight to the trunk. It matures with lots of twists and turns providing lots of vertical interest. Selected in the 1980's by Delbert and Barbara Hupp of Drake's Crossing Nursery, Silverton, Oregon. *Limited Availability* 

### Abies procera 'Glauca' (prostrate form)

Spreading Zone 5 Dwarf 3'h x 6'w Bluish Green 🔾

This steely blue cultivarient of the Noble fir grows slowly and will produce one or more upright leaders with age. These leaders can be removed to maintain a prostrate form. Formerly *Abies procera* 'Glauca Prostrata.'

### New Abies procera 'Pesek'

Spreading Zone 5 Dwarf .5'h x 1.5'w Blue 🔾

This rare miniature noble fir is petite enough to add a delightful flash of steely blue to the smallest corner of your garden. Perfect for a container or a rock garden. Originated before 1998 in the Czech Republic. Limited Availability

### Abies veitchii 'Heddergott'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 4'h x 6'w Green 🔘

The brilliant white undersides of the needles on this dwarf Japanese fir must have received a double portion of the waxy coating typical to this species. Glossy green needles perfectly expose this bright white feature giving a winter frost look even in the heat of summer. A low growing, rounded, spreading plant, this durable German selection is the perfect size for the home landscape. Hardy and ornamental, 'Heddergott' provides an element of refined color interest. *Limited Availability* 

#### New Abies veitchii 'Rumburk'

Prostrate Zone 3 Dwarf 1'h x 3'w Green 🔘

Loaded with two-toned silver green needles, 'Rumbark' is a dense, slow growing collector's gem with a prostrate habit that offers a frosty thrill of high contrast color year-round. Vetch's fir is native to Japan and one of the most cold hardy species in the genus. *Limited Availability*

### Acer buergerianum 'Miyasama yatsubusa'

Bush Dwarf Zone 6 3'h x 3'w Green

This slow growing form of trident maple is useful in small gardens, containers, and bonsai. New tri-lobed foliage emerges a purple-bronze color which quickly turns green and hardens with a thickened, leathery texture. Autumn foliage begins bright yellow and becomes intensely red-orange to purple before falling to expose gray bark which becomes uniquely textured with maturity. The small tree prefers full sun in moist, well-drained soil. *Limited Availability* 

#### Acer campestre 'Carnival'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Variegated

Spring brings deeply cut, small, green leaves with pink and white variegation on the outer edges. The pink fades leaving a wide, white margin. Although tolerant of many soil types, it prefers alkaline soils. Used for hedging in Europe, hence the common name of hedge maple. Limited Availability

### **ACER**

Year-round ornamental features distinguish the many, diverse maple (Acer) trees. New spring growth emerges in a panoply of color and variegation. Summer foliage tends toward richer tones, and vivid fall leaves of these deciduous trees display show-stopping palettes of color. In winter, exquisite branching structures and colorful or exfoliating bark contribute understated beauty to landscapes. All maples, including upright and cascading forms, and slow-growing, dwarf bushes boast durable constitutions, adapting to a

wide variety of conditions. Most prefer sun to part shade with well-drained soil.

### Acer griseum

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Green 🤝

Plant a specimen of the beautiful paperbark maple where its many features will provide drama throughout the year: in winter, massive branches that thicken with age display exquisitely peeling, orange-copper bark; in spring and summer, trifoliate leaves of rich green provide shade; and in fall, they change to brilliant red. Compact size, good health, and durability add to the characteristics of a great landscape tree. Native to China.

### Acer japonicum 'Aconitifolium'

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Green

A low branched, small garden tree with deeply cut leaves, the Fernleaf Full Moon Maple is dark green in summer. Then in fall, the foliage turns a magnificent array of intense colors; brilliant scarlet shading into purple. Prominent red seeds also contribute to the show.

### Acer japonicum 'Rising Sun' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Green

'Rising Sun' is a recent Iseli selection with uncommonly large, heavily textured leaves—up to 8" across—that give the tree a tropical look. Its vigorous, multi-branched habit produces sturdy limbs and rigid twigs, and the autumn show of red, yellow, and orange will take your breath away.

### Acer japonicum 'Vitifolium'

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Green 👄

True to the name, the leaves of 'Vitifolium' resemble grapevine foliage, but they appear on a tree with a stiff, spreading branch structure. The soft, fluffy leaves, light-to-robust green from early spring through summer, change in fall to a spectacular display of orange-yellow and bright red. Early, showy, red and white flowers add extra ornamental interest. Tree performs best with filtered or full sun in rich, moist soil.

### Acer palmatum 'Arakawa'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Green 🤝

Gardeners who value winter interest will seek out this cultivar for its bark. Nicknamed the Rough Bark Maple, the vigorous, upright tree develops cracks, creases and fissures that give it an aged look, even when young. Whether contained, trained or grown out in the garden, it is a collector's tree that offers green, palmate foliage in summer, an exceptional display of scarlet red in fall, and fascinating bark for winter. Considered by many as the top choice for red fall color in Pacific Northwest gardens.

### Acer palmatum 'Bihou'

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Green

In Japanese, 'Bihou' means "beautiful mountain range," and the Golden Bark Japanese Maple offers loveliness in every season. Striking yellow bark with an orange tinge captivates winter garden visitors. New leaves emerge pink in spring, turn light yellow green, and finally mature to a fresh emerald. Fall turns the canopy to gold, and the bright branches are revealed once again as the leaves drop. Illuminate your garden with this unique and compact specimen tree.







### Acer palmatum 'Bloodgood'

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Red 👄

A deservedly popular Japanese maple, this robust, upright tree has large, deep red leaves that push bright red in spring. Leaves mature to deep, rich purple and retain their color well, even during the heat of summer. Crimson fall color and scarlet, winged seeds add extra interest to this sturdy garden standard.

### Acer palmatum 'Butterfly'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Variegated

This vase-shaped tree has small, dainty, blue-green and white variegated leaves that have a light tinge of pink along the edges in the spring. In the fall the white margins become a blazing magenta. Differs from 'Beni shichihenge' with only subtle pink coloration on the margins and a taller, narrower habit.

#### Acer palmatum 'Fireglow'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Red 🕒

The bright red leaves of 'Fireglow' have a luminescent quality and the best summer color retention of all upright, red *palmatums*. An intense cherry glow appears in fall. This well-branched Japanese maple has a moderate growth habit and a broad crown in maturity, so it is appropriate for shading small courtyards and patios. Introduced by Fratelli Gilardelli Nursery, near Milan, Italy.

### Acer palmatum 'Hime shojo'

Bush Dwarf Zone 5 6'h x 6'w Red

New growth emerges a cherry red, changing to maroon. Although a relatively small plant, it puts on the bright new growth all summer long that stands out against the older darker foliage. In the fall the entire plant beams a brilliant red. The dwarf twiggy form is excellent for containers or bonsai culture. *Limited Availability*

### Acer palmatum 'Katsura'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Yellow/Green 🤝

One of the first Japanese maples to leaf out, this small, upright, dwarf tree sports small, five-lobed leaves that start out brilliant yellow-orange and turn to rich green. In fall, a phenomenal display of pastel yellows and oranges prevails.

#### Acer palmatum 'Koto maru'

Bush Dwarf Zone 5 6'h x 6'w Green 👄

A delightful dwarf form, 'Koto maru' will dazzle the eye and please the gardener as a slow growing, small leaf form of Japanese maple. Ideal for containers on the patio or deck, the naturally small stature is a winner in the rock garden or any small garden space. Tiny yellow-green leaves emerge in spring with a touch of amber. A subsequent foliar flush later in the season is dramatic as brighter amber and orange leaves appear and contrast nicely among the more mature green leaves. Autumn brings a spectacular finish of bright red, orange and yellow on this compact, rounded, small tree.

### Acer palmatum 'Koto-no-Ito'

Broad Upright Zone 5 6'h x 4'w Green 🗭

The name 'Koto-no-Ito' means "harp strings," a reference to the string-like quality of this Japanese maple's narrow, deeply divided leaf lobes. It also has a dense, twiggy branch structure that works as the harp frame. The unique, divided leaves have a tinge of red in spring, stay green during summer and change to yellow in fall. Bright green bark and a graceful, elegant form carry the show in winter.

### **New Acer palmatum 'Little Sango'**

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Green 🗭

'Little Sango' is a stunning variation of the Coral Bark Japanese Maple that provides unparalleled winter interest in a compact, bushy form. Because it is slower growing than 'Sango kaku', the vivid red bark on its young branches is especially long-lasting, and its twiggy, densely branched habit increases the intensity of the color. In spring, the foliage emerges chartreuse before maturing to deeper green and then finally glows bright yellow to orange in fall. Thanks to its small size, this extraordinary specimen is equally enjoyable in a container or planted in the ground. *Limited Availability* 

#### Acer palmatum 'Mikawa yatsubusa'

Bush Dwarf Zone 5 6'h x 4'w Green

The delicate leaves of this multi-branched, compact cultivar grow closely together and overlap one another like shingles on a roof, producing a dense leaf cover and forms a nearly spherical form. New foliage, light yellow-green with red tips and margins, turns medium green as it matures. In fall, brilliant fiery red and darker red leaves create a dramatic show. Ideal in a small space, courtyard or near water. Prefers a cool site with moist, well-drained, woodland soil.

### Acer palmatum Mini Maple™

Bush Dwarf Zone 5 Size Defined By Culture Green 🗭

Selected seedlings of Japanese maple for small scale container gardening and tablescapes. In summer the small palmate shaped leaves are green but as these are seedlings, each individual tree will have slight variations in the spring and fall leaf color. *Fanciful Gardens® Only* 

#### Acer palmatum 'Ojishi'

Broad Upright Zone 5 10'h x 7'w Green 🗭

Like 'Shishigashira,' the Female Lion's Head Japanese Maple, this cultivar, named for the mythological male lion of Japanese drama, displays short branches loaded with small, densely packed, rich green leaves. They produce a sculptural quality that seems to develop features, so when the foliage turns burnt orange-gold in fall, a lion's head and mane are easy to imagine. The leaves are slightly larger and less crinkled than 'Shishigashira,' with a red margin on the spring flush. Use this superb cultivar for small areas and for bonsai culture.

### Acer palmatum 'Osakazuki akame'

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Green

This selection shares the same sturdy stature as 'Osakazuki' but has a broader form. The leaves are somewhat smaller but share the same amazingly brilliant crimson color in fall. Olive orange in spring, they mature to green in summer preparing for their fall show.

### Acer palmatum 'Oshio beni'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Red

Bright, orange-red, spring foliage softens into green with bronzed reddish overtones in summer. In fall, the medium-sized leaves become brick red and then luminescent scarlet. This mid-sized, upright maple is well-branched with a spreading canopy.

#### Acer palmatum 'Pung kil'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Red

The long slendor lobes of this linearilobum type maple emerge light red in spring, becoming a dark purple-red that maintains throughout the summer. Fall brings a brilliant red before leaf fall when the purple stems provide winter interest. A full dense plant that keeps its good color in partial shade.

### Acer palmatum 'Rhode Island Red'

Broad Upright Zone 5 6'h x 6'w Red

An outstanding new dwarf selection, this upright tree boasts very dense, compact branching, which yields a round-to-ovate outline. It has mid-size, palmate leaves with a bright red, spring flush that darkens as leaves mature. Fall foliage is outstanding orange to red, and in winter, dark red stems add drama to the scene. From Rhode Island Nurseries, Middletown, Rhode Island.

### Acer palmatum 'Sango kaku'

Broad Upright Zone 6 20'h x 15'w Green 🤝

Widely known as the Coral Bark Maple, this cultivar is popular for its flaming, coral red bark that stands out against drifts of snow in winter. The leaves emerge in spring bright yellow-green with a red margin, changing to soft green for summer, which provides a sharp contrast to the glowing, coral bark. Bright golden fall color is a flashy effect too.

### Acer palmatum 'Sharp's Pygmy'

Bush Dwarf Zone 5 4'h x 4'w Green

This naturally compact seedling selection from Jimmy Sharp, Boring, Oregon, is an outstanding miniature maple. The dense, rounded shrub is covered with small, green, palmate leaves with coarse margins from spring through summer; in fall, dramatic red leaves give way to a great branch structure for winter. Site this beauty where it can be seen "up-close and personal"— in the container, the courtyard or patio bed, or for bonsai culture.

### Acer palmatum 'Sherwood Flame'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Red 👄

Distinctive branching gives this small garden tree a strong, formal look. Trees broaden with maturity to develop a rounded silhouette which provides good winter interest, especially combined with bark that has distinctive silver striations. Red foliage from spring through early summer, turns to a reddish-green in late summer. In fall, leaves brighten to cherry red. A seedling selected from 'Burgundy Lace' and developed by Will Curtis, Sherwood, Oregon.

### Acer palmatum 'Shindeshojo'

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Pink Red/Green

The astonishing spring color of this small, dense tree starts out intensely dark, fuchsia pink and changes to brilliant crimson scarlet. In mid-summer, the color calms to pleasing green with red-orange margins. Then fall extends the colorful show with a blend of orange and yellow. A classic form provides handsome winter stature.

### Acer palmatum 'Shishigashira'

Broad Upright Zone 5 10'h x 7'w Green 👄

This distinctive Lion's Head Japanese Maple, also known as 'Meijishi,' the name for the mythological female lion of Japanese drama, has upright branches that are thickly covered with dense layers of foliage. The small, green, heavily crinkled leaves coat the tree's outward spreading branches, and in fall, brilliant oranges and yellows arrive very late, which extends the season's dramatic color display. Aristocratic stature carries the show in winter.

### **New Acer palmatum 'Sir Damon'**

'Sir Damon' is a rare cultivar of the coral bark Japanese maple. Its vivid, rich red stems retain their brilliant color longer than standard varieties. In spring, delicate light green foliage is edged with a subtle blush that is striking against the vibrant red branches. Come autumn, the tree transforms as bright golden-yellow leaves stand out beautifully against the warm, reddish bark. A true four-season standout, 'Sir Damon' makes an outstanding specimen tree, particularly well-suited for smaller garden spaces. Selected by Crispin Creations Nursery. *Limited Availability* 

### Acer palmatum 'Tobiosho' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Green

A broad, upright habit, even when young, supports the dense, green canopy of this Japanese Maple from spring through summer. In fall, the foliage bursts into an unsurpassed show of brilliant colors that starts on the lower branches and advances up the tree. Gold appears first and changes to orange, then scarlet until all three colors are on display at once. Finally, they all go completely scarlet. This special garden tree was selected by and named for our former production manager, Milt Tobie, in the fall of 1982.

### Acer palmatum 'Tsukushi gata'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Red 👄

The deep red-black, dark chocolate foliage of this small tree holds its surprising color all summer, when the star-shaped leaves change to scarlet before they drop. A rare form of Japanese maple, it produces green seed set as well as green venation, petioles, and bark, all of which contribute to a dramatic color contrast.

### Acer palmatum 'Tsuma gaki'

Broad Upright Zone 5 10'h x 7'w Green 👄

In spring, the soft, pendant chartreuse leaves on this small, rounded tree sport dramatic edges of persimmon red, an effect that looks like many dainty leaf-hands with brightly painted "nails." In summer, the foliage continues to demand attention as it develops wide, deep red margins and light cream centers. The late Jean Iseli had a fondness for this tree.

### Acer palmatum 'Twombly's Red Sentinel'

Broad Upright Zone 5 20'h x 15'w Red

This vigorous, upright, red tree develops an unusually columnar habit that fits into a smaller space than forms with broad canopies. Leaves maintain their dramatic red color all season long, and after they drop, the branches continue the colorful display. They darken to a deep, warm red that stands out against the grays and whites of winter. Found by Ken Twombly, Twombly Nursery, Monroe, Connecticut.









### Acer palmatum dissectum 'Crimson Queen'

Cascading Zone 5 7'h x 10'w Red

Sculptural, cascading branches and finely dissected, colorful leaves make this classic selection one of the finest of the deep red laceleafs. Foliage emerges bright crimson, deepens to burgundy in summer and finishes with brilliant scarlet in fall, maintaining its color despite summer heat and humidity. The elegant, mounding plant produces a dense, broadly spreading structure that makes a dramatic impact near water, on a bank or in a courtyard scene.

### Acer palmatum dissectum 'Orangeola'

Cascading Zone 5 7'h x 10'w Red/Green 👄

'Orangeola' is an excellent name choice for this laceleaf maple with bright red-orange new spring growth. Foliage on the long cascading shoots turns a rich red-green through the summer, only to contrast with a second flush of orange for a beautiful two-tone effect. Fall brings a fiery orange red that holds longer than most other *dissectums*. Long pendulous branching provides many options for the eventual form of the specimen.

This up and coming red laceleaf selection has it all and could become the future nursery standard. It boasts bright red, new growth that turns dark purple-maroon and maintains its color through hot summer months. In fall, flaming scarlet foliage marks the end of the growing season. The vigorous, compact tree, with the finest scaffolding of all cutleaf Japanese maples, grows slowly into a beautiful, cascading mound. Introduced to the U.S. from New Zealand in 1990.

### Acer palmatum dissectum 'Seiryu'

Broad Upright Zone 5 15'h x 12'w Green 👄

This green laceleaf maple, the only upright one offered by Iseli Nursery, is a vigorous tree with finely dissected leaves that are tolerant of heat. In fall, the foliage turns to a wonderful display of strong gold, light yellow, and crimson. Although upright, the tree maintains a compact stature, and its feathery leaves, which hold up well to heat, bring about dappled sunlight.

### Acer palmatum dissectum 'Spring Delight'

Cascading Zone 5 7'h x 10'w Green

### Acer palmatum dissectum 'Tamukeyama'

Cascading Zone 5 7'h x 10'w Red

First listed in 1710 in Japan, this extremely vigorous cultivar of superior quality has survived the test of time. Long, cascading branches produce spring foliage that is bright crimson and summer foliage that turns dark, purple-red and retains its color even in hot, humid summers. In fall, the rediscovered tree's foliage, which is bold and more coarsely dissected than other selections, changes to scarlet. The wider-than-tall cultivar performs beautifully by a water feature or enriching a Japanese style garden.

### Acer palmatum dissectum 'Viridis'

Cascading Zone 5 7'h x 10'w Green

The cascading, mounding form of 'Viridis' displays the classic branching of a Japanese maple. Its bright green, delicately dissected leaves turn golden yellow and red in fall. The well-known, green, weeping cultivar handles full sun or shade, and it produces vigorous growth but stays compact.

#### Acer shirasawanum 'Aureum'

#### Acer triflorum

### Callicarpa bodinieri 'Profusion'

### Carpinus betulus 'Columnaris Nana'

#### Cedrus atlantica 'Glauca'

The popular blue Atlas cedar is a dramatic, pyramidal tree with clusters of short, somewhat stiff, frosty, silver-blue needles. Tight, stubby seed cones mature in two years.



Putty in the hands of a sculptor, the Weeping Blue Atlas cedar boasts an extremely pendulous habit that can be staked or trained to conform to any shape. From a living waterfall to a grazing, blue, woolly mammoth, plants respond to the whimsy of their designers. Short, irregular, steely blue needles thickly cover the swooping branches and give specimens both color and texture. Trees develop massive trunks with time. Found in France before 1890.

# **CEDRUS**

Tall, ornamental conifers, the "true cedars" hail from the mountains of the eastern Mediterranean and western Himalayas. Since wood from cedar trees is resinous and durable, even when in contact with soil and moisture, ancient cultures utilized it for lumber to construct palaces, temples and ships. The species, including *Cedrus atlantica* (Atlas cedar), *C. deodara* (deodar cedar), and *C. libani* (cedar of Lebanon), grow to massive dimensions. Our production is limited to cultivars selected for landscape use, including weeping, columnar and dwarf forms. Give cedars well drained, dry soil in sunny sites.

#### Cedrus atlantica 'Green Wave'

Spreading Zone 6 Dwarf 4'h x 8'w Bluish Green 🔘

A real treat to have this Atlas cedar with naturally sculpted features. With a spreading form, the tiered branching creates open flat planes of foliage. Very sturdy branches make it a durable plant in the garden. 'Green Wave' originated as a witch's broom on a 100 year old *Cedrus atlantica* 'Glauca' at the Morris Arboretum, University of Pennsylvania.

#### Cedrus atlantica 'Horstmann'

Broad Upright Zone 6 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Blue 🔘

This compact German selection offers the same striking, powder blue foliage color as the popular blue Atlas cedar (*Cedrus atlantica* 'Glauca'), but the slow-growing, intermediate-size tree maintains a smaller stature. It grows about 6–8" a year and makes an attractive, small tree with considerable presence for the smaller garden. Ascending branches covered with tight clusters of bright needles give the tree an elegant look that is at once full and open.

#### Cedrus deodara 'Gold Cascade'

Spreading Zone 7 Intermediate 8'h x 15'w Yellow O Strongly cascading branches are sunny side up on this eye-catching cedar. The foliage is yellow on top and light green on lower or inner branches. When young the desirable tree is naturally spreading. With time it slowly matures into a broad upright tree but with selective pruning it can also be maintained as a garden sized spreading specimen.

#### Cedrus deodara 'Gold Cone'

Broad Upright Zone 7 Large 25'h x 15'w Yellow 🔘

Golden yellow, outer needles and blue-green inner needles on the pendulous branches of this large, graceful, pyramidal selection of Himalayan cedar produce a big, bright accent in the landscape. A relatively fast grower, 'Gold Cone' becomes a large tree, similar to the species, but with a more upright habit and a smaller footprint. Found at Wm. Goodard Nursery, Victoria, B.C.

#### Cedrus deodara 'Kashmir'

Broad Upright Zone 7 Large 25'h x 15'w Bluish Green 🔘

Long, blue-green needles distinguish this noteworthy cultivar of deodar cedar. Elegantly arching, pendulous branches with softly textured foliage add strength and character to large landscapes. Propagated from a seedling at J. Franklin Styer Nursery in Pennsylvania.

#### Cedrus deodara 'Prostrate Beauty' Iseli®

Spreading Zone 7 Intermediate 5'h x 10'w Bluish Green 🔾

This unique beauty combines a spreading, horizontal habit with distinctive, blue foliage. The mid-size conifer is nearly flat when young but eventually develops a leader with age, unless pruned to keep it low. New blue-green needles keep their soft, feathery look as they mature. Found at Iseli Nursery in 1979, this form's superior qualities will define it as a classic among cedars.

#### Cedrus deodara 'Snow Sprite'

Broad Upright Zone 7 Intermediate 10'h x 7'w Yellow 🤝

This irregularly mounding, compact conifer sends out ivory white new growth that turns creamy yellow. The unique, mid-size plant develops a leader with age, but stays small and compact compared to the species. It is best grown in part shade where the bright foliage will practically "glow in the dark."

#### Cedrus libani 'Blue Angel'

Broad Upright Zone 6 Large 25'h x 15'w Bluish Green 🔘

A creative mind might see an angel's wings when viewing the branches that arch out, then delicately weep at the tips. Covered in powder blue needles that are longer than typical for the species, the irregular branching forms an open structure. The Lebanon cedar thrives in well-drained soil and open sunny locations. This pleasing and attractive form is no exception. *Limited Availability* 

#### Cedrus libani 'Glauca Pendula'

Broad Upright Zone 6 Large 25'h x 15'w Green 🔘

This irregular, upright Lebanon cedar produces a graceful, vertical form with long, pendulous branches covered with long, stiff, dark green needles. The slow-growing tree develops an impressive stature, with a large trunk, wide, spreading branches and a flat-topped crown. Occasional, random horizontal branches look like an arm or leg. Barrel-shaped cones add interest.

#### Cedrus libani var. stenocoma

Broad Upright Zone 5 Large 25'h x 15'w Green 🔘

From mountainous southwest Turkey, this subspecies of *Cedrus libani* displays better cold hardiness than other forms, making it useful for Northern climates. Like the species, the dark green conifer changes from a pyramidal form in youth to a flat-topped, picturesque tree with stiff, horizontal branches and a massive trunk in maturity. Attractive, broadly columnar, durable and unusual, it performs best in full sun.

#### Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Fastigiata'

Norrow Upright Zone 6 Infermediate 10'h x 5'w Green Dark green, shiny needles radiate along this plant's vertical branches making them look like brushes. With age, the striking, upright conifer produces multiple, bottle-brush leaders and takes on a vase shape. Plants prefer shade and they make dramatic, mid-size focal points, hedges, or clusters. They show good deer resistance too, and when established, tolerate drought and heat well.

# Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Gold Splash' Iseli®

Spreading Zone 6 Dwarf 2'h x 4'w Yellow

A golden splash of color lands in the garden with the planting of this Japanese plum yew. Large thick bright yellow needles fill the prostrate growing branches that cover the ground and fill the spaces around the blues, greens, and reds of other plant materials. Plant beneath larger trees where there is natural sun protection and create a

Long, deep green, glossy needles cover this low growing, spreading Japanese plum yew. Much denser than other spreading forms, it is easily pruned to use as an alternative to *Buxus* for a low edging or bordering plant. The plant's preference to partial shade makes it ideal for lining the north or east side of buildings where shade prevails much of the day. Deer resistance is of added benefit in areas with abundant wildlife.

### Cephalotaxus harringtonia 'Prostrata'

Spreading Zone 6 Dwarf 4'h x 8'w Green 👄

V-shaped waves of deep green needles accentuate the undulating, horizontal branches of this broad, spreading conifer. In spring, beautiful lime-green growth sets the stage for clusters of prominent pollen cones that open on older wood. Plants prefer shade and they look great in groups beneath larger trees. When established, this deer resistant cultivar from Hillier's Nursery, England, tolerates drought and heat too.

# **CEPHALOTAXUS**

Commonly known as Japanese plum yew for fruit like an edible plum and appearance similar to large-leafed yews, *Cephalotaxus harringtonia* cultivars are small evergreen trees or large shrubs. Useful landscape plants in their own right, they also fill in well for yews (*Taxus*), because they tolerate shady conditions and resist foraging deer. Especially useful in hot southern states and

in deer country. Native to Korea, China and Japan, plants are hardy to USDA Zone 6 and warmer areas of Zone 5.

#### Cercidiphyllum japonicum Claim Jumper™ ('HSI1')

Broad Upright Zone 4 Medium Tree 20'h x 15'w Yellow 🔾

Colorful throughout the growing season, this golden beauty will become a treasured garden tree. Claim Jumper<sup>TM</sup> begins the season with young leaves emerging yellow with a prominent pink blush. As the new leaves begin to harden, the bright golden yellow color dominates through summer. Autumn brings a copper blush giving the tree an overall golden glow, becoming more intense until leaf drop reveals a fine silhouette of branches through the winter months.

### Cercidiphyllum japonicum 'Morioka Weeping'

Weeping Zone 4 Medium Tree 20'h x 15'w Green O

This rare weeping form differs from 'Pendula' in that it has larger, puckered leaves and an informal habit. Spring leaves emerge with a reddish-purple cast that softens to blue-green in summer. Great fall color includes bright yellow with hints of orange and apricot. The tree grows vertically when young and matures to a more strongly weeping form with age. Best color and growth in full sun. Formerly thought to be a selection of *Cercidiphyllum magnificum*. From Brookside Gardens, Wheaton, Maryland. *Limited Availability* 

#### Cercidiphyllum japonicum 'Red Fox'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Medium 20'h x 15'w Red 🔾

A medium-sized tree with multi-season appeal, 'Red Fox' should find a place in many of today's smaller gardens. Spring brings the emergence of soft, purple-red, heart-shaped leaves that mature through the season subtly changing to a crisp wine red and then blue-green in summer. As autumn arrives, the leaves make a drastic change to a bright golden yellow with hints of pinkish orange. The fall foliage also has a delightfully sweet and spicy scent that fills the air with an exotic perfume. Thoughtful pruning will encourage a majestic winter silhouette.

# CERCIDIPHYLLUM

Commony known as the katsura tree, this genus has year-round appeal. Characteristic heart-shaped leaves, similar to those of *Cercis*, emerge in spring and offer an array of colors from spring through autumn. The fall air is filled with a sugary sweet and spicy aroma emitted by the foliage. They enjoy full sun and need regular

moisture, especially while getting established in hot dry climates.

#### Chamaecyparis lawsoniana 'Minima Aurea'

This dwarf Lawson's cypress has flat, ascending sprays of foliage that glow with brilliant yellow. The golden color is most intense where the feathery foliage gets the most sun, creating a unique optical effect. Dense branching gives it a soft, ruffled texture and a full, conical habit. This shrubby Lawson's cypress has ferny sprays of deep green foliage splashed with creamy white variegation. Use this cheerful little charmer to brighten up the dappled shade of a woodland garden. Originated as a seedling selected by Derek Spicer of Leicestershire, UK. Limited Availability

# **CHAMAECYPARIS**

Scores of choice *Chamaecyparis* cultivars offer a wide range of color, texture, and shape for nearly every landscape need. We have selected cultivars of *C. lawsoniana*, known as Lawson's cypress, that have shown good tolerance to root disease pressure and have an assortment of colors and shapes. *C. nootkatensis*, or the Alaska cedar, succeeds with abundant humidity and soil moisture in full sun. *C. obtusa*, commonly known as false or Hinoki cypress, thrives in moist, well-drained soil in full

sun or partial shade and contributes sprays or fans of fine evergreen foliage to the landscape. *C. pisifera*, also known as Sawara cypress, claims the best cold hardiness of the genus. Its cultivars thrive in full sun and contribute beautiful, feathery foliage to garden settings. *C. thyoides*, also called white cedar, does best in full sun where its foliage contributes outstanding color. *Chamaecyparis* grow native in North America, Japan and Taiwan.

## Chamaecyparis nootkatensis 'Glauca'

Excellent for use in the foreground of upright garden elements or covering a large bank. Found in the Kerdalo garden, built by a Russian refugee in Brittany, France post World War II.

#### Chamaecyparis obtusa 'Kosteri'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 6'h x 4'w Green 👄

This well-known selection has enjoyed popularity for decades, since its introduction about 1915. Superior form, slow growth and shapely sprays of feathery, twisting foliage that cups gracefully downward account for its reputation. # CUPRESSOCYPARIS CUPRESSUS

True cypress trees (Cupressus) make excellent evergreen hedges or elegant specimens in warm, sunny garden locations. Characterized by graceful, symmetric shapes and colorful, fragrant foliage, true cypress trees also provide showy bark and resinous, aromatic wood. Given good drainage, Cupressus will tolerate poor dry soils. Cupressocyparis is a genus composed of naturally occurring hybrids of different Cupressus species and Chamaecyparis nootkatensis, providing attractive trees that generally are quite vigorous.

An ericaceous plant, they do best with moist, acidic soil in sun to part shade.

# **GINKGO**

Considered a "living fossil", this ancient genus has biloba as its only remaining species. Having survived millions of years, the maidenhair tree is an urban tolerant deciduous conifer. The characteristic bi-lobed leaves flutter in the wind and provide good fall color. Basically pest free and salt tolerant, it does best in full sun but tolerates partial shade. For many years the Chinese have used *Ginkgo* for medicinal purposes and modern cultures now use *Ginkgo* extract for improving memory function with increased blood flow to the brain.

## **HYDRANGEA**

Hydrangeas have long been an old-fashioned cottage garden favorite beloved for their big, vibrant flowers. Our selections include cutting-edge cultivars that meet the contemporary gardener's needs for plants that are compact, low maintenance, and wow with stunning blooms on sturdy stems that last from summer to fall. Panicle hydrangeas (*H. paniculata*) are incredibly adaptable and durable. Both cold and heat tolerant, they're easy to grow in full sun or part shade and aren't picky about soil pH as long as they have good drainage. They bloom

### Ilex aquifolium 'Ferox Argentea'

### *llex crenata* 'Jersey Jewel'

### New Ilex crenata 'Piccolo'

## **ILEX**

From the whole host of *Ilex* species, we have chosen these few cultivars for their small, dense evergreen foliage and

unusual habits. These dwarf, ornamental plants make great companions for other plants, where they punctuate garden scenes with their fine texture and tight forms. Give plants well-drained, humus-rich soil in sun to part shade.

The dark green foliage and silver-blue berries are lush and attractive. 'Torulosa' responds well to creative pruning and may frequently be seen trimmed into pom-pons or other whimsical shapes.

## **JUNIPERUS**

The native range of juniper spans much of the northern hemisphere, from the Arctic to China, tropical Africa and the mountains of Central America. This could explain the versatility and variety of the genus, which is among the most useful of conifers. Diverse

growth habits and colorful seasonal foliage guarantee that there is a juniper suitable for nearly every landscape situation. Most are extremely cold hardy and resist pollution. We offer selections chosen for striking colors, superior habits and interesting shapes. These adaptable plants enjoy well-drained soil and full sun.

### Juniperus chinensis 'Trautman'

Norrow Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 15'h x 4'w Bluish Green C A hardy alternative to the temperate Italian cypress. This narrow, coarse textured, bluish gray-green spire has incredible potential throughout the gardening world. As a single specimen it will make a majestic statement as it towers above other garden plants while maintaining a small footprint. Planted in a row, 'Trautman' will serve as a screen of unusual beauty because of its unique color and texture. Will thrive in full sun and well-drained soil. Selected by the late Herbert Trautman, a highly respected Wisconsin nurseryman.

### Juniperus communis 'Berkshire Sparkler'

Prostrate Zone 3 Dwarf 2'h x 6'w Green/Plum 🔾

A low spreading form with dark green foliage through the growing season, changing to a rich plum purple in winter. The needles are arranged in a way that the white undersides are visible, creating a plant that seems to sparkle. Selected by Bob Fincham as a mutated reversion of 'Berkshire', it is a colorful ground cover, especially in winter. Plant in well-drained soil.

### Juniperus communis 'Green Carpet'

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 1/2'h x 6'w Green 🔾

The bright green, spring growth on this densely textured, ground covering juniper darkens as it matures into a thick carpet. The tidy, compact plant is extremely hardy and adaptable to a wide range of soil and climate conditions. It covers ground slowly.

### Juniperus communis 'Miniature'

Narrow Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 1½'w Bluish Green 🔾

More durable, adaptable and dense than the popular 'Compressa,' this improved selection sports the same compact, bluish green foliage and upright habit. It differs, though, in its broader pyramidal shape and its better tolerance to wind, cold and reflected sun. Try this reliable, vertical accent that is well suited for containers and a range of styles, from elegant to casual.

## Juniperus conferta 'All Gold'

Prostrate Zone 6 Dwarf 1'h x 8'w Yellow 🔘

'All Gold' is exactly as its name implies—all gold! It is an extremely durable blazing gold shore juniper with a prostrate growth habit that quickly covers the ground. The prickly awl-shaped foliage is very dense and stays gold year-round. Native to the Japanese coast, it does well in seacoast environments. Best color in full sun.

## Juniperus conferta 'Silver Mist'

Prostrate Zone 5 Intermediate 2'h x 10'w Bluish Green 🔘

This low, spreading selection has thick, stiff branches and densely set, short branchlets. Sharp, blue-green needles have broad white, stomatal bands that contribute a silvery sheen to the appearance. New growth has a reddish brown tinge. Tolerant of many conditions, especially poor and sandy soils, but not soggy soils.

### New Juniperus horizontalis 'Glomerata'

Prostrate Zone 3 Dwarf 1'h x 3'w Green 🔘

'Glomerata' maintains beautiful blue-green foliage throughout the growing season, acquiring vibrant purple tones in winter. This juniper forms a dense, low-spreading ground cover. An excellent choice for drought tolerant and low maintenance landscapes.

### Juniperus horizontalis Limeglow™ ('NOSlg')

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 2'h x 4'w Yellow 🔘

Not your typical juniper! This amazing selection boasts feathery foliage in electric chartreuse, a color that makes a striking contrast to other greens in the garden. Cool winter temperatures bring a mahogany color to the foliage, but the bright tips remain. Its spreading, vase form and juvenile foliage lend a cheery presence in almost any garden, including one with hot, dry conditions. ### Juniperus horizontalis 'Mother Lode' Iseli®

Prostrate Zone 3 Dwarf 1/2'h x 4'w Yellow

Bright, golden yellow foliage for summer and rich, burgundy plum for winter recommend this extremely flat, ground-hugging juniper for long-term garden interest. Discovered at Iseli Nursery in 1982 as a sport on 'Wiltoni,' it performs admirably in full or partial sun. It grows slowly and forms an exceptional presence. Let it cascade over a bank, define a mound, complement stonework or cover ground planted in masses.

### Juniperus horizontalis 'Pancake'

Prostrate Zone 3 Dwarf 1/2'h x 4'w Bluish Green 🔾

Feathery, scale-like foliage covers the ground as this plant grows flat as a pancake. Growing not more than about 6" high, the branches will root as they creep along the ground. Gray-blue in color through the growing season, it takes on light purple hues in winter. Prefers full sun in dry, sandy soils and is drought tolerant when established.

### Juniperus procumbens 'Nana'

Prostrate Zone 5 Dwarf ½'h x 4'w Green 🔾

Tight growth, with primarily juvenile foliage, produces a dense, glaucous green, spreading carpet useful for cascading over rocks and walls or for covering the ground with a dense mat. Very suitable as the "spiller" element in containers. Grafted on a standard, it gives a garden space some lift, then spills to the ground.

## Juniperus scopulorum 'Woodward'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Large 20'h x 3'w Bluish Green 🔘

'Woodward' juniper distinguishes itself by maintaining a flexible single leader without pruning, unlike most columnar juniper forms. The bluish green foliage turns a grey-blue in winter, adding seasonal interest. Very hardy, it offers the Italian cypress appearance to landscapes in cold climates. Introduced by Ft. ### Juniperus squamata 'Blue Carpet'

Prostrate Zone 3 Intermediate 3'h x 12'w Blue O

The name of this tough, hardy cultivar almost says it all. "Blue" points to the color of the sharp, over-lapping, densely arranged needles. "Carpet" acknowledges the plant's low, spreading form and might suggest its adaptable nature (it tolerates dry soils). Even "squamata" refers to the scaly bark typical of the species. Together, these features add up to an excellent, ground-covering choice for banks, slopes and other challenging sites.

## Juniperus squamata 'Blue Star'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 2'h x 3'w Blue 🔘

This immensely popular juniper, discovered in Holland as a witch's broom on 'Meyeri' and introduced in 1964, deserves its reputation as a winning garden selection. It has sharp, blue, densely arranged needles, filling short branches that suggest the tips on a many-point star, and a useable form that is about as broad as tall.

### Juniperus squamata 'Holger'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 4'h x 8'w Yellow/Blue 🔾

This dense, wide-spreading juniper produces bright, creamy yellow new growth that stands out above the plant's older, blue foliage. The unique color combination makes a stunning and dramatic show. Sharp, densely arranged, pointed needles and scaly bark are typical of the species.

### Juniperus virginiana 'Taylor'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Large 20'h x 3'w Green 🔘

Medium green foliage takes on bronze tones in winter on this tall narrow form of juniper commonly known as eastern red cedar. It offers another substitute for the Italian cypress with its exceptional cold hardiness. Reported to be disease resistant. Selected as a random seedling in Taylor, Nebraska, it serves as an excellent formal screen or windbreak when planted in a row.

### Juniperus x Star Power® ('J.N. Select Blue')

Believed to be a hybrid of *Juniper communis* and *chinensis*, the densely foliaged plants are fast growers. A deer resistant screen can develop in a short period and provides wildlife protection for other areas of the garden. Selected in 1998 by Michael Yanny, at Johnson's Nursery, Wisconsin. It thrives in full sun and well-drained soil.

### Juniperus x pfitzeriana 'Golden Joy'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 6'w Yellow 🔘

This new cultivar from Wiel Linnsen of Holland offers improvements over other golden junipers. For one, its yellow is brighter than other available options and it maintains the brilliant color throughout the year. In addition, it is easy to grow and has classic hybrid-media form, spreading and compact. It grows more slowly, too, so it will stay beautiful and maintain a manageable size for years.

## Juniperus x pfitzeriana 'Sea Green'

Spreading Zone 4 Intermediate 6'h x 12'w Green O

The dense foliage and spreading, arching shape of this conifer make it an excellent choice for sculpting; we like to prune it into pom-pons. The rich, mid-green foliage, which includes both adult scales and a complement of juvenile needles, starts the year with a burst of light green, growing tips. *Artistic Forms Only*

#### Larix decidua 'Horstmann's Recurva'

Broad Upright Zone 2 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green 🔘

Medusa comes to mind when viewing this unusual, deciduous conifer with seriously curly "hair." The small tree develops wispy branches that twist and curl to fantastic effect, especially in winter, after needle drop. In late winter, rosy buds swell along the gray curlicues and herald longer days earlier than other conifers. Shaving-brush clusters of bright green needles erupt in spring, soften during summer and fire up to golden yellow for fall. A seasonal stunner, for full sun and moist soil in summer.

#### Larix decidua 'Pendula'

Weeping Zone 2 Lurge Size Defined by Culture Green C Luminous, lime green foliage brightens this weeping, mid-size tree in spring. In fall, needles turn golden before dropping to reveal tawny twigs. As trees age, branches divide and the tree's girth increases. Use this beautiful selection, a refreshing contrast to evergreen conifers, in gardens with an Asian theme. Prefers moist soil in summer.

## **LARIX**

Unlike most conifers, the deciduous larch produces beautiful fall color, then loses its needle-like leaves and displays bright, new growth each spring. These seasonal changes combine with graceful growth patterns to offer beauty and interest year-round. The upright, dwarf and weeping forms will thrive in sites with ample moisture in full sun or light shade. Extremely cold hardy, larch trees grow best in northern regions, where they tolerate heavy, wet soils.

### Larix decidua 'Puli'

This new, weeping European larch is an elegant alternative to 'Pendula.' When staked, its slender branches create a narrow silhouette that is more dense and lighter green than 'Pendula.' If unstaked, branches slowly spread out along the ground and make an effective groundcover. Very attractive in gardens with an Asian aesthetic.

### Larix decidua 'Varied Directions'

Weeping Zone 2 Large Size Defined by Culture Green O

This name could be an understatement! In fact, the vigorous, spreading habit of this deciduous plant produces robust twigs that propel the branches up and out, in—that's right—varied directions. Golden tan branches, covered with thick twigs, eventually arch down and cover the ground in a unique configuration for each plant. Bright green spring foliage changes to gold in autumn before needles fall. Selected by Dr. Sydney Waxman, University of Connecticut.

### Larix gmelinii 'Romberg Park'

Globe Shaped Zone 2 Dwarf 6'h x 6'w Green 🔘

A superb new form of Dahurian larch, this dwarf, deciduous conifer develops tufts of short branches that give it appeal in all seasons. In early spring, it is one of the first to push growth, programmed from its cold native habitat and short growing season to take full advantage of warming temperatures. The softly textured, light green needles change to yellow in fall, and then drop to reveal the plant's many short stems for winter interest. Site the irregular, low plant in moist, light soil in a sunny rock garden.

### Larix kaempferi 'Wolterdingen'

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 4'h x 8'w Green 🔘

A compact, spreading Japanese larch, this attractive plant provides exceptional seasonal interest for tight landscapes and rock gardens. In early spring, soft, new, blue-green needles emerge and continue to decorate the delicate mound through the growing season. In fall, needles change to rich yellow before they fall to show off ornamental, reddish-brown branches with scales reminiscent of an armadillo's armor. Discovered in a park in Wolterdingen, Germany in 1970, by G. Horstmann.

#### Larix laricina 'Deborah Waxman'

Broad Upright Zone 2 Dwarf 4'h x 3'w Green 🔘

An upright dwarf form, this seedling selection of American larch has ascending branches that exhibit light, blue-green needles through the growing season. Showy, rosy flowers appear in spring, and fall brings on a display of coppery gold. Found in a trial bed at the University of Connecticut and selected by Dr. Sydney Waxman.

### Larix sibirica (syn. russica) 'Conica'

Narrow Upright Zone 2 Large 20'h x 10'w Green 🔾

An extremely hardy, upright narrow spire, 'Conica' produces nearly horizontal branches that sweep up at the tips. Seasonal color is light green in spring and summer and bright yellow in fall, providing a nice contrast to darker evergreen conifers.

## Metasequoia glyptostroboides Amber Glow™ ('WAH-08AG' PP29,472)

Broad Upright Zone 5 Large 25'h x 15'w Yellow 🔾

A brilliant yellow dawn redwood that does not burn in the hot summer months. The foliage emerges in spring with a touch of burgundy that is quickly replaced by completely yellow needles. Fall brings on an orange tinge before needle drop and the characteristic reddish brown shaggy bark is exposed for the winter garden visitor. Selected as a seedling of 'Gold Rush', it is fast growing but maintains a compact look. Asexual reproduction prohibited without license.

### Metasequoia glyptostroboides 'Hamlet's Broom'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 8'h x 6'w White Variegated 🤝

A compact form of dawn redwood with creamy white variegated foliage. Fades to green in summer, becoming a deep russet in fall before needle drop as winter approaches. Characteristic shaggy orange bark can be admired on this tree that has a size and growth rate amenable to today's urban landscapes. Thrives in moist soil. *Limited Availability* 

## **METASEQUOIA**

An ornamental, deciduous conifer, the dawn redwood earned renown when, thought to be extinct, it was re-discovered in China in 1941. Known before only as a fossil, the hardy tree and its cultivars have distinguished features, including feathery leaves, a delicate, airy form and reddish, fissured bark. Best in full sun and moist soil.

### Metasequoia glyptostroboides 'Miss Grace'

Norrow Upright Zone 5 Intermediate Size Defined by Culture Green O'Miss Grace' becomes a superb living sculpture as the branches naturally arch out and down. The small green needles and thin branches drape freely from the firm structure in an attractive weeping fashion. Autumn brings a color change when the needles turn shades of yellow, orange and red before dropping to expose an interesting framework of branches with peeling red bark. Discovered as a witch's broom in New York, it was introduced by Buchholz & Buchholz Nursery, in Gaston, Oregon.

## Metasequoia glyptostroboides 'Schirmann's Nord'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 6'h x 4'w Green 👄

This bushy and compact tree has foliage that emerges white in spring, fades to a bronze green in summer, and becomes dark reddish-brown in fall. Sometimes listed as 'North Light', it is smaller in size than 'Hamlet's Broom'.

### Microbiota decussata

Prostrate Zone 3 Intermediate 2'h x 10'w Green C Soft feathery scale-like foliage covers this low spreading conifer. The flattened sprays are a bright green in summer, turning a bronzy purple in fall through winter. Works well as a juniper substitute. Native to Russia, it is very hardy. Best in full sun but will tolerate partial shade. Requires very well-drained soil. *Fanciful Gardens*® *Only* 

### Millettia japonica 'Hime fuji'

Vine Zone 6 6'h x 4'w Green O

Translated, the name of this bushy plant is "dwarf wisteria", but similarity to that robust vine is limited. It does have narrow, green-bronze leaflets reminiscent of wisteria, but it is much smaller and performs in places that could never accommodate a big, heavy vine. Exceptionally long running shoots are best trimmed off to maintain a dense shrub. Provide rich, moist soil and ample water in summer. In colder climates, grow it in a container that can be moved inside for winter. Fanciful Gardens® Only

### Ophiopogon japonicus 'Nana'

#### Paeonia x 'Gordon E. Simonson'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Small Broadleaf 2½'-3' Globe Pink Flower Being twice the size of other Itoh peony blooms, the bold fuchsia colored petals and bright yellow centers are a standout in the garden. The sturdy stems that are characteristic of the Itoh hybrids, are strong enough to hold these massive blooms upright without staking. With a long blooming season from spring to early summer, the attractive green foliage on the upright mounding form maintains through fall. Plant with the eyes, or buds, of the roots 1-2" below the soil line in moist, well-drained soil. Easy care and is deer resistant.

## **PAEONIA** The varieties in our line of Itoh

peonies are hybrid crosses of herbaceous and tree peonies, combining the best qualities of both. These hybrids have the mounding growth habit of the herbaceous peonies and the large flower size and sturdy stems of the tree peonies. #### Picea abies 'Acrocona'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green C Even when young, this delightful conifer develops remarkable, raspberry red cones on the tips of its branches in spring. The unusual coning habit tends to modify growth rate and shape and to produce a broad, spreading pyramid, which becomes wider than tall with age. Known since 1890, when found in a forest near Uppsala, Sweden, the plant has an apt name, 'Acrocona,' which means "with terminal cones on the ends of the branches."

#### Picea abies 'Blaze' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 3 Dwarf 8'h x 6'w Red/Green O

A spring surprise when this dense upright tree explodes with bright red new growth. The red tips fade to reddish-brown and then green by late spring, early summer. The short needled, compact seedling selection from 'Rubra Spicata' thrives in moist, well-drained soil.

Brood Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green O Named for Lord Clanbrassil of Ireland, who introduced several *Picea abies* cultivars during the late 18th century, this selection matures slowly into a beautifully compact, broadly pyramidal plant—the ideal shape for a dwarf Christmas tree.

### Picea abies 'Cobra' Iseli®

Weeping Zone 3 Large Size Defined by Culture Green 🔘

Each example of this new seedling selection from Iseli Nursery has its own wildly unique character that combines the ground-covering qualities of its parent, *Picea abies* 'Pendula,' with the bizarre, snake-like branching of *Picea abies* 'Virgata.' When staked, trees have a relatively tall, straight, sparsely branched main trunk and a thick, ground-hugging skirt that radiates outward with dancing, cobra-like leaders. Best in full sun.

### Picea abies 'Cupressina'

Narrow Upright Zone 4 Large 25'h x 6'w Green 🔘

The narrow, fastigiate form of 'Cupressina' is in high demand for urban and boundary plantings where strong vertical accents are required. This selection grows quite quickly and withstands snow loads better than other fastigiate types.

### Picea abies 'Elegans'

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 2'h x 4'w Green 🔾

The densely arranged, slightly ascending branches of this dark green, flat-topped, dwarf nest spruce will add classy elegance to any garden. Plants break bud and develop bright green new growth earlier in spring than other nest types. Use the irregularly rounded, slow-growing, spreading plant as a low garden accent.

#### Picea abies 'Fat Cat'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 4'h x 4'w Green 🔘

A dense, rounded form of the bird's-nest-type Norway spruce, this uniformly globose selection is a blown up version of 'Little Gem.' It has very short, stiff needles and short shoots that give it the appearance of a rotund, green cat, curled up in a ball for a snooze. Iseli Nursery acquired the plant, a witch's broom from *Picea abies* 'Graciosa,' in 1994 and officially named it for a tubby, slumbering feline. Extremely hardy, reliable and slow-growing, this kitty creates a presence in the landscape, but don't try to pet its "fur."

#### Picea abies 'Formanek'

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 4'h x 8'w Green 🔾

This radically prostrate, slow-growing form of Norway spruce will become a densely matted, spreading carpet over time. If staked up, its strongly weeping branches cascade down and create a pendulous form. Unstaked, it is the perfect plant to creep over and around rocks.

### Picea abies 'Frohburg'

Weeping Zone 3 Intermediate Size Defined by Culture Green  $\bigcirc$  This narrower form of weeping Norway spruce offers a strictly pendulous habit with a full, spreading skirt and a slower growth rate. A finer texture is the result of shorter, slender, medium green needles. Use this choice selection for landscapes with limited space. Introduced by A. Haller Nursery, Switzerland in 1973.

#### Picea abies 'Gold Drift'

Weeping Zone 3 Large Size Defined by Culture Yellow

This pendulous form of Norway spruce adds color to the garden in whatever shape and boundaries the gardener allows it to have. Early spring brings lime green new growth. The foliage that is fully exposed to the sun turns a vibrant yellow in late spring and summer. The brilliance continues until winter when the color becomes more subdued. Can be allowed to ramble as a groundcover, drape over rock walls, or become a garden feature when staked upright. We thank Bob Fincham of Coenosium Gardens for discovering this plant that was chosen to be the 2013 Collector's Conifer of the Year.

### Picea abies 'Gregoryana Parsonsii'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Green O

An irregular, dwarfed alpine shape makes this selection the perfect rock garden specimen. It sports relatively thick, green needles, tan stems and bright brown buds. Longer, flatter needles and a slightly more open habit distinguish 'Gregoryana Parsonsii' from 'Gregoryana.'

### Picea abies 'Hildburghausen'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 4'h x 4'w Green 🔘

Short, very dark green needles are closely spaced on short stiff shoots creating a tight compact appearance. 'Hildburghausen' is globe shaped for many years, but eventually becomes a broad upright. Originating as a witch's broom, this symmetrical gem works well in the rock garden or the small landscape where it will stay in scale with miniature and other slow growing plants.

## Picea abies 'Hillside Upright'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 12'h x 6'w Green O

'Hillside Upright' is an elegant plant with irregular branching that produces a natural look stylish enough for use in a container or as a focal point. Its needles, which are among the darkest of the green-needled conifers grown by Iseli Nursery, contrast well with the tree's brown buds. #### Picea abies 'Lanham's Beehive'

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 3'h x 4'w Green 🔘

The late Gary Lanham found this unusual, boldly textured, compact Norway spruce in 1994 in Kentucky, a witch's broom nearly 10' up in a mature *Picea abies*. Intrigued by the interesting beehive form, Gary took it to Klein's Nursery in Louisville, and from there, it made its way to Iseli Nursery. The needles of 'Lanham's Beehive' are longer and thicker than other dwarf cultivars and they have a slight glaucous tint. These features, combined with prominent, cinnamon colored stems and buds, create a dramatic effect.

#### Picea abies 'Little Gem'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 1'h x 2'w Green 🔘

Tufts of tiny green needles cover the many short shoots of this dense, tight, spreading bun. Originally a witch's broom on 'Nidiformis' and more rounded than its parent, it was discovered in 1958 and has been an extremely popular plant ever since. Its tough constitution and restrained growth assure good performance in a variety of garden situations where it resembles a lush, green pincushion.

#### Picea abies 'Mikulasovice'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Dwarf 2'h x 3'w Green 🔘

A distinctive dwarf selection with unusually long needles for such a compact *Picea abies* selection. It has an irregular habit that tends to be wider than tall. Use where an easy care alpine-like conifer is needed that will remain small with no pruning needed for many years. *Limited Availability*

#### Picea abies 'Motala'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 4'h x 4'w Green 🔘

A unique needle arrangement and color give this novel form of Norway spruce a distinctive look. Blunt-tipped needles radiate out and downward on short, stout, vertical branches, which produces an Abies-like appearance. Minute, glaucous striations on needle tops complement the color with a silver-blue cast. This rare selection enhances any landscape.

#### Picea abies 'Mucronata'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 6'h x 4'w Green 🔘

A dark green, compact selection, this irregularly mounding spruce produces thick, stiff shoots with large, brown buds. Plants grow slowly when young, but as they mature, the rate of growth accelerates and they eventually develop leaders with several sub-leaders.

### Picea abies 'Nidiformis'

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 4'h x 8'w Green 🔘

A well-known, flat-topped, nest-type spruce, this broadly rounded, symmetrical plant produces layers of dense, horizontal or slightly ascending branches. It grows very slowly and becomes much wider than tall with a nest-like depression in the center after many years. Refreshing light green.

Plant a row of young 'Pendula' plants with stake and wire supports to train them into a narrow, living fence.

#### Picea abies 'Pumila'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 4'h x 4'w Green 🔘

Unusually uniform branches, covered with short, dark green needles, point up and out on this distinct, nest-style spruce. When young, it has a more rounded habit than the familiar, flatter types, but it eventually spreads out with age too. New growth appears later in the season than it does on other nest types.

#### Picea abies 'Pusch'

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 2'h x 3'w Green 🔘

This small, slow-growing Norway spruce, a witch's broom from 'Acrocona,' produces loads of bright red cones on many short shoots in spring. The tiny cones brown as they age, but continue to decorate the irregular, dwarf variety year-round. Globose when young, the small spruce develops an upright broad shape with maturity. It is extremely hardy and grows well in full sun or part shade. From the former East Germany.

The needles at branch tips are shorter than the older foliage, creating a bushy foxtail look. Globe shaped when young, it develops a leader as it matures to take on a sculptural form.

## New Picea abies 'Ripplebrook' Iseli®

Spreading Zone 3 Dwarf 1½h' x 3'w Green 🔘

An Iseli Introduction seedling selected from *Picea abies* 'Rothenhausii'. This new dwarf cultivar has a prostrate habit that forms a low mounding shape with age. Can be grown as a slow growing ground cover or staked upright as a gentle weeper. Delicate tiny green sprays of needles cover this very dainty specimen, appearing frozen in time. Great for containers or as a specimen plant for collectors. Truly a one of a kind.

### Picea abies Royal Splendor® ('Noel')

Broad Upright Zone 3 Large 25'h x 15'w Green 🔘

Royal Splendor® has captured the best features of the majestic *Picea abies* along with its own favorable attributes, delivering a truly refined and noble tree for larger gardens. Rich, bright green needles cover the upward sweeping branches. As the plant ages it maintains a pyramidal form without developing the weeping secondary branching typical of the species. Beautifully symmetrical, this extremely hardy selection is fit for royalty. The registered mark Royal Splendor® is used under license granted by the NDSU Research Foundation.

### Picea abies 'Rubra Spicata'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Large 25'h x 15'w Red/Green 🔘

For about two weeks in spring, deep red new growth gives this uncommon cultivar a surprising look for a spruce. Gradually, the foliage changes to reddish-brown and then to green. Although it grows less quickly than the species, 'Rubra Spicata' eventually becomes a large tree with an open habit. Found in Czechoslovakia in 1973, propagated in England, and introduced to the United States in 1981.

### Picea abies 'Sherwood Compact'

Norrow Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 15'h x 8'w Green O Site this narrow, pyramidal tree where its strongly ascending branches can develop into a mid-size, distinctly upright cone in the landscape. In addition to size and shape, the cultivar produces many soft brown shoots and clean green needles. Use it as a specimen in a small space that deserves a big impact or use it as part of a privacy wall. Another great selection from nurseryman Andy Sherwood of Oregon.

### Picea abies 'Skyhigh WB'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 3'h x 3'w Green 🔾

An attractive plant with an interesting and irregular habit. Perfectly round on the sides but the top has irregular clumps that eventually grow together and form a dense broad upright plant. The green needles have a pleasing bluish cast. This witch's broom was first discovered in the 1980's by Ken Brooks, growing at the top of a 80-foot tree at Riverside Cemetery in Moline, Illinois. Skyhigh! With perserverance for several years, Randy Dykstra produced a successful grafted plant that is planted at the Bickelhaupt Arboretum, Clinton, Iowa.

### Picea abies 'The Limey'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 15'h x 12'w Yellow

New growth emerges a bright lime green but as the season progresses through summer and in to winter, the plant becomes two-toned. The top of the needles turn a very pleasant yellow while the undersides and lower shaded portions of the plant remain green. It is a fast grower with fairly short needles resulting in an open tree when young that fills in with age. Originating at Memorial University of Newfoundland Botanical Garden, it is very hardy and makes a colorful statement during a cold bleak winter. Full sun and moist, well-drained soil is best.

## Picea abies 'Tompa'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Dwarf 3'h x 2'w Green 🔘

Fresh green needles and a compact habit make this slow-growing Norway spruce a great choice for smaller landscapes and rock gardens. Its wide, conical shape resembles the well-known Alberta spruce for which it is a superior alternative.

### New Picea abies 'Will's Zwerg'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 12'h x 6'w Green O

This dwarf spruce originated from a witch's broom found by Hans Will in Barnstedt, Germany in the 1970's. Dense and irregular branches, which are covered in glossy, bright green needles, give it a tufted texture and a narrow form. This fresh take on the Norway spruce is an intriguing and easy-care option for small gardens that demand attractive, cold hardy specimens.

### Picea bicolor (alcoquiana) 'Howell's Dwarf'

Spreading Zone 5 Intermediate 6'h x 12'w Bluish Green 🔾

The most colorful of all bicolors, this selection boasts needles with bright, silver-blue undersides, green tops and a tint of yellow on the most exposed surfaces. A flat-topped bush when young, it eventually develops into a pyramidal tree, or you can maintain its flat form by removing upward shoots that start from rose-purple buds.

### Picea engelmannii 'Bush's Lace'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Large 25'h x 6'w Bluish Green 🔘

'Bush's Lace is a vigorous growing form of Engelmann spruce. With a strong central leader, its branches extend out before drooping downward. Unique in that, although the branching is a bit irregular, it still makes a stately presence in the garden. Engelmann spruce is native to the higher elevations of the Rocky and Cascade Mountains and is adapted to dealing with extreme winds and cold.

Rarely seen in the trade, the muted, blue-green conifer thrives in cool, mountain conditions, so its subtle, rugged beauty makes a perfect addition to the alpine garden.

## Picea glauca 'Big Berta' Iseli®

Narrow Upright Zone 2 Intermediate 12'h x 6'w Green 🔘

Not your typical dwarf Alberta spruce, this cultivar is a big "berta". It has the same 'Conica' type juvenile foliage but the needles are much longer and growth rate is much faster, resulting in a more open form. A hybrid of *Picea glauca* 'North Star' and *pungens* 'Montgomery, it's a hardy choice for northern landscapes.

### Picea glauca 'Blue Planet'

Globe Shoped Zone 4 Miniature 1'h x 1'w Bluish Green C Sporting some of the tiniest needles on the planet, this miniature bun is a reliable choice for tight garden spaces. The short, thin needles have a slight blue cast which complements the true greens and blues in the landscape. Excellent selection for the railway garden, troughs, and rock garden. Expose to full sun in moist, well-drained soil. Fanciful Gardens® Only

### Picea glauca 'Blue Teardrop'

Brood Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Bluish Green O This aprly named white spruce cultivar has very short, greenish-blue needles and dense branching that gives this pyramidal tree a full, rounded habit. Small reddish brown cones contrast with the cooling blue, fine textured foliage. Tough and compact, this moderate grower makes a refined focal point for the woodland garden and shines even when space is limited, and winters are harsh. Originally found as a sport on *P. glauca* 'Echiniformis' by Bob Fincham at Mitsch Nursery in Aurora, Oregon.

### Picea glauca 'Conica'

Narrow Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 6'h x 3'w Green 🔘

The classic dwarf Alberta spruce may well be the most popular, familiar, dwarf conifer in cultivation. It grows slowly into a perfectly conical, small tree with a thick coating of fine, green needles. Its perfect form, compact growth and dense foliage make it ideal for entry, container and landscape. It responds well to shearing and shaping for topiary too. Found at Lake Leggan, Alberta, Canada, by Prof. J.G. Jack and Alfred Rehder of the Arnold Arboretum in 1904, it appreciates consistent moisture, good nutrition and an occasional blast from the garden hose during summer to increase pest resistance.

### Picea glauca 'Humpty Dumpty' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 2'w Green 🔘

The habit of this extremely dense, Alberta-type plant explains its name: short and plump, kind of egg-shaped, like Humpty Dumpty. With nearly equal base width and height, it forms an almost perfect pyramid that is only two-thirds the size of 'Conica.' Found as a witch's broom and introduced by Iseli Nursery.

### Picea glauca 'Jean's Dilly'® Iseli®

Narrow Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 1'w Green 🔘

Pronounced "John's" Dilly, this extraordinary, Alberta-type selection bears the name of dwarf conifer pioneer Jean Iseli. It was named by his brother, André, to note the plant's remarkable qualities. Much smaller, denser and slower growing than other Alberta types, its short, fine needles display a distinctive twist during the growing season. Spring growth starts about 3–4 weeks later than 'Conica's. Found at Iseli Nursery in 1981, this signature plant is a fitting choice to honor the co-founder of Iseli Nursery.

Iseli fell in love with the distinctive tree's formal, narrow, conical shape and its pendulous, stiffly held, drooping branches and loads of light, gray-green foliage. The original tree was propagated by D. Hill Nursery from a tree in a native stand near Guelph, Ontario. The elegant, dramatic conifer was nearly lost to cultivation.

Extremely dense, compact and slow growing, this miniature selection resembles 'Conica' in form, but offers a special feature. 

#### Picea mariana 'Mont Tremblant'

A very vigorous grower with lots of movement. Branches arch up, out, and then strictly downward. Well suited to peat and boggy areas, it makes an interesting focal piece in many confined spaces.

#### Picea obovata 'Arctos'

'Arctos' is a befitting name of this Siberian spruce. Big bears and the trees both thrive in the extremely harsh environments of the northern reaches of the world. Having a very unique bluish green color, it is a pleasant sight in bleak, barren areas. Growing not too fast and not too slow, it has short needles, is tough, and durable. Makes a good cornerstone specimen or focal point.

This witch's broom selection of Serbian spruce has the characteristic two-tone needles that are dark green with silvery white stomatal bands on the undersides. Its smaller in size compared to other 'Nana' types, and short needles make for a darker colored plant than other similar cultivars. It is quite dense and globose at an early age but develops a leader over time. Selected by Gunter Horstmann of Horstmann Nursery in Germany in the 1970's.

#### Picea omorika 'Kamenz'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 2'h x 4'w Bluish Green 🔘

A beautiful, spreading Serbian spruce, 'Kamenz' has a distinctive two-tone look. Short branches covered with typical *Picea omorika* needles, green on top and silver beneath, show off both colors at once. With shorter needles and a wider spread than *Picea omorika* 'Pimoko,' the adaptable cultivar complements the form of a bank or slope nicely.

#### Picea omorika 'Pendula Bruns'

Norrow Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 15'h x 3'w Bluish Green O This tall, spire-like focal point has the narrowest silhouette of all the large, upright Serbian spruce cultivars. Its strictly weeping branches boast two-tone needles that are deep, bluish-green on top and silvery beneath. For the most part, though, the silvery sides remain hidden, so 'Pendula Bruns' has a darker appearance than *Picea omorika* 'Pendula.'

#### Picea omorika 'Pimoko'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf Bluish Green O

A selection from Bruns Nursery in Germany.

Color and texture set 'Pimoko' apart from other dwarf Serbian spruce selections. The showy, dark green needles, accented with a bluish cast and silvery undersides, seem to sparkle. Reddish brown buds add to the effect too. Globe-shaped when young, this superb rock garden plant develops multiple leaders and an upright, broad shape with maturity.

#### Picea omorika 'Silberblue'

### Picea orientalis 'Skylands'



This outstanding industry standard silver-blue spruce was originally part of the conifers accumulated by dedicated collector, Col. R.H. Montgomery. This *Picea pungens* was named to honor him at the Montgomery Conifer Collection dedication in 1949. The original plant can still be seen there today. The slow-growing, dwarf spruce is globe-shaped when young, but it will form a leader as it matures and develop a wider-than-tall, broad upright shape.

Hardy enough for extremely cold climates, it is an ideal choice for a low, colorful sphere of color in garden bed or large container.

# Picea pungens 'Zafiro' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 2 Dwarf 8'h x 6'w Blue 🔘

Blue, gem-like color combined with a slow rate of growth makes this tree suited for gardens with limited space. It has the outstanding lush blue needles of its parent, 'Moerheim,' but differs in size and habit from other selections with much slower growth and a rounded profile. This compact dwarf tree is an excellent alternative choice to the generic "dwarf blue globe spruce" commonly specified in suburban landscapes.

# Picea rubens 'Lake Street Steeple'

Narrow Upright Zone 4 Large 20'h x 4'w Green 🔘

'Lake Street Steeple' is a dark green spruce with a tall, extremely narrow, weeping habit. Short, strictly weeping branches adorn the length of the tree and small cones fill the upper branches as little ornaments. The very unique form will be useful in small gardens in need of a vertical accent with little horizontal space to spare. Staking can be advantageous to insure its stability. Hariet Roberts, the great grandmother of Tim Wolfe, Lake Street Garden Center, New Hampshire, planted the original seedling in the late '60s on the garden center property where it still lives today. *Limited Availability* 

# Picea sitchensis 'Papoose'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 8'h x 6'w Bluish Green 🔾

'Papoose' has sharp, two-tone, blue-green needles. Late in spring, clusters of buds open at the branch tips and form blossom-like bursts of foliage. The slow-growing tree displays a dense, globose habit when young, but produces a leader with age and becomes a tight, upright, broad shape. Found by Gordon Bentham, Vancouver Island, British Columbia, it is considered deer resistant.

#### New Picea sitchensis 'Peve Wiesje'

Globe Shaped Zone 5 Dwarf 2'h x 2'w Bluish Green O Originally found as a witches' broom in the Netherlands, this dwarf cultivar of Sitka spruce was first introduced by plantsman Piet Vergeldt.

Forming a tight, dense glove, it keeps a very tidy habit and has attractive contrasting silvery blue and green needles.

#### Picea sitchensis 'Silberzwerg'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 8'h x 6'w Bluish Green 🔘

The name of this compact Sitka spruce, which means "silver dwarf," says it all. It refers to the plant's outstanding needle color and its reliable, slow-growing habit. The plant's very dense, very blue needles display a unique reversal from the norm: the two-tone, blue-green effect results from silvery blue on the tops of needles with dark green on the reverses. Similar in size and shape to 'Papoose,' the striking foliage of this selection boasts a better blue. Resists browsing deer.

#### Picea x 'Troemner'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Large 25'h x 15'w Bluish Green 🔘

This hybrid cross of *pungens* and *omorika* has prickly *pungens* style needles with characteristic *omorika* blue-green needles. Sweeping branches and fairly fast growth form a specimen sized tree that gets better and better with age. Selected by Allen Troemner, University of Wisconsin Forestry Department. *Limited Availability*

#### Pinus aristata 'Horstmann'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 4'h x 3'w Green 🔾

Short blue-green needles are covered with tiny white flecks of resin that are a distinguishing characteristic of the Rocky Mountain bristlecone pine. 'Horstmann' is noteworthy because of its more uniform branching habit compared with the typical shrubby haphazard branching pattern of this long lived species. Growth rate is comparable to the species. Does well in dry, rocky soils but appreciates more moisture than its cousin *longaeva*, the Great Basin bristlecone pine. Use as a focal point in the rock or alpine themed garden. *Limited Availability* 

#### Pinus banksiana 'Al Johnson'

Broad Upright Zone 2 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Green O

A unique, slow-growing, character tree, this North American pine has an open, irregular habit that suggests exposure to harsh conditions. The rustic look is accentuated by silver bark and by candles that are so pitch-covered they look as if they have been dipped in wax. The extremely hardy conifer takes tough conditions and makes a striking feature in the rock garden or patio container.

# **PINUS**

Simply put, pines are pretty. Not only that, but this enormous genus of striking ornamental conifers displays plenty of desirable characteristics, and we offer more choices of pines than we do from any other genus. Selections include a diverse palette of useful forms, a rainbow of ornamental colors and texture that contributes year-round character and class to landscape and garden settings. Undemanding pines also exhibit exceptional adaptability and require little maintenance. Given well drained soil, pines develop superior drought tolerance, and once established, require little pruning or fertilizing.

Fastigiate or columnar pines add height, but require only a narrow space in the landscape. Fine pyramidal forms provide vertical accent. Low, compact spreading and mounding pines

become fabulous groundcovers. Pendulous or weeping trees provide high drama. We assure reliable clonal uniformity for the pines we grow, since we propagate them by grafting and rooted cuttings.

## Pinus banksiana 'Uncle Fogy'

Broad Upright Zone 2 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green 🔘

Wildly undulating, pendulous branches give unique character to every plant of this distinctive form of jack pine. Plants bend and swoop to create a curvy, living sculpture decorated with resinous winter buds. This collector's plant, first discovered in a garden in Richfield, Minnesota, seems to be a reference to everyone's eccentric relative. Extremely hardy and adaptable, it tolerates heat, cold and dry, sandy or poor soils.

## Pinus bungeana 'Rowe Arboretum'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Large 20'h x 15'w Green 🔘

Named for the Ohio arboretum where it was found, this form of Chinese lacebark pine is noteworthy for its habit, which is neater, more compact, and more uniform than the open, irregular branching of the species. The tree's narrow needles have an interesting, waxy look, and the beautifully shaped tree displays showy bark, a patchwork of white, green, and brown, as it matures.

### Pinus cembra 'Algonquin Pillar'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Large 20'h x 10'w Bluish Green 🔾

This narrow, upright selection of Swiss stone pine has long, two-toned needles that twist and weave together to form lustrous branches. It is extremely hardy and needs little pruning to maintain a large, but slender stature. As yet underused, it makes a vastly superior alternative for *Pinus flexilis* 'Vanderwolf's Pyramid,' especially in suburban landscapes. With slower growth, it fits in many positions and stays in scale. Trees retain foliage to the base, unlike pines that lose needles on shaded lower branches. *Limited Availability*

#### Pinus cembra Prairie Statesman® ('Herman')

Norrow Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 12'h x 6'w Bluish Green O Super hardy with a super form, Prairie Statesman® will make an elegant statement under some of the harshest conditions. Soft, emerald green foliage with a hint of silvery blue adorns this perfectly symmetrical tree. Its columnar habit provides a narrow footprint but with a smaller stature than 'Algonquin Pillar,' making it suitable for the home garden as well as large landscapes. Drought tolerant and extremely cold hardy, it is an excellent selection by Dr. Dale Herman, North Dakota State University. American Conifer Society 2015 Collector's Conifer of the Year. The registered mark, Prairie Statesman,® is used under license by NDSU Research Foundation.

#### Pinus cembra 'Westerstede'

Brood Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Bluish Green O Named for an ancient German city in a nursery region similar to Oregon's Willamette Valley, this beautiful pine represents the finest in hardy garden conifers. Long, luxurious needles give the small, upright tree a full, fluffy look. Slower and wider that other cembras, it has graceful branching, attractive color and striking cones that offer year-round interest and character in a small space.

#### Pinus contorta 'Chief Joseph'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 6'h x 4'w Green/Yellow C The deep, rich, golden yellow winter color of 'Chief Joseph' creates a striking beacon of brightness in the drab winter landscape. Medium green during spring, summer, and fall, it inconspicuously resides in

the garden. Shorter and cooler days bring a dramatic color change that moves the lodgepole pine to center stage. Golden yellow winter needles can show some discoloration in early spring prior to the emergence of the new green growth. Found by Doug Will in the Wallowa Mountains of northeastern Oregon, it is very slow growing and has proven difficult to propagate.

#### Pinus contorta 'Spaan's Dwarf'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 4'h x 3'w Green 🔾

Short, closely set, dark green needles and a sweeping, irregular habit give this dwarf shore pine an unusual look that suggests coral. Named for the nurseryman who found it in Washington state, 'Spaan's Dwarf' develops a sturdy, open, upright branch structure and dramatic character with age. Slow growth and a wider-than-tall form make it a natural for rock garden, bonsai and container culture.

# Pinus contorta 'Taylor's Sunburst'

Brood Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green/Yellow O Brilliant, golden yellow, new growth erupts in spring and makes 'Taylor's Sunburst' a vibrant show-stopper. The striking color lasts for weeks, then gradually softens to a light, yellow-green as the foliage hardens. Red pollen cones add contrast to this extraordinary lodgepole pine that was introduced by Alan Taylor, who found it high in the Colorado Rockies.

#### Pinus contorta var. contorta

Broad Upright Zone 5 Large 20'h x 15'w Green 🔘

The shore pine, iconic inhabitant of the rocky, windswept cliffs of the Pacific Northwest coast, is elevated to an elegant garden centerpiece when trained in the Hindu pan style by our artisans. Let your eye follow the furrowed, silvery brown bark of the sinuous trunk up to floating clouds of dark green foliage, dense pads of short, twisted needles. While regular pruning is required to maintain this scultped form, the shore pine is an easy care species that can adapt to challenging soils and tolerate salt spray. *Artistic Form Only* 

## Pinus densiflora 'Burke's Red Variegated'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Large 20'h x 15'w Variegated C Another Dragon's Eye type of Japanese red pine. Wide, horizontal, creamy yellow bands on each needle are visible year-round, becoming a brighter darker yellow in colder climates. Looking down at the shoot one sees a yellow circle around each red bud. Appears to be hardier than regular 'Oculis Draconis'.

#### Pinus densiflora 'Globosa'

Globe Shaped Zone 4 Dwarf 6'h x 6'w Green 🔘

This outstanding selection of Japanese red pine provides gardens with superior year-round beauty. Its many upright branches create a dense, structural form, like an egg on its end. The needles, which are shorter and darker green than those of the Tanyosho types, stand up well to both cold and drought. Attractive bark with age.

#### Pinus densiflora 'Golden Ghost'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Large 20'h x 15'w Variegated 🔘

This Japanese red pine seems to shimmer in the sun with its long slender light green needles that consistently have one or two circular yellow bands on them. When looking down at the shoot, one sees green and yellow rings surrounding a red bud. The decorative orange-red stems that are characteristic of densiflora add to the overall colorful appearance. Grows best in slightly acid well-drained soil.

#### Pinus densiflora 'Low Glow'

Globe Shaped Zone 5 Dwarf 4'h x 6'w Green 🔘

The short, thick, bright green needles of this vibrant, dwarf Japanese red pine keep their color all year long. They grow densely along stout horizontal branches that give the unusual pine a flat-topped, low-growing habit. Prominent tan buds add interest to this seedling introduction from a witch's broom selected by Sydney Waxman, University of Connecticut.

# Pinus flexilis 'Cheyenne'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 15'h x 10'w Green O

This tidy, attractive form of limber pine originated from seed collected near Cheyenne, Wyoming in a population of trees near the furthest eastern edge of its range. This pioneering pine species is noted for tolerance to weather extremes. Although adaptable to harsh dry conditions it is at its best in the landscape setting grown in moist well-drained soil. With light green needles and a hint of silvery blue streaking through the needles, the uniform growth and compact shape make this an easy care garden tree.

#### Pinus flexilis 'Extra Blue'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Large 25'h x 15'w Blue 🔘

Aptly named, the standard size limber pine 'Extra Blue' boasts outstanding blue color on its clusters of five, long, slightly twisting or curving needles. The fast-growing tree, which prefers moist, well-drained soil, develops an attractive pyramidal habit and 3–6" long, light brown, resinous cones.

# Pinus flexilis 'Vanderwolf's Pyramid'

Narrow Upright Zone 4 Large 25'h x 12'w Bluish Green 🔘

An increasingly popular selection, 'Vanderwolf's Pyramid' makes a dramatic specimen tree or an effective screen or small grouping in large garden beds and borders. Long, blue-green needles cover the uniformly ascending branches, which together form a large, upright, pyramidal tree that broadens with age. Superb color and soft texture add a formal, but friendly look to the landscape. Prefers moist, well-drained soil.

## New Pinus heldreichii 'Atze Saule'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 10'h x 5'w Green 🔘

A unique selection of Bosnian pine that offers an unusual element to the garden. Clusters of short needles emerge in spring and grow longer at random rates, leaving a mix of needle lengths within a given whorl. Gives the impression of a "bad hair day" with four to five inch long needles that droop and curve alongside those that are two inch. Forming a dense pyramidal form, the classic rich green color and general good health of the species contribute to an attractive, yet exceptional, garden feature. *Limited Availability* 

#### Pinus heldreichii 'Banderica'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 4'h x 3'w Green 🔘

This gorgeous cultivar of Bosnian pine boasts clusters of clean, lustrous, dark green needles decorated with white resin on buds, candles and stems. The easy-care conifer with a big personality conjures words like chubby, squat and pyramidal, but none does justice to the compact, friendly dwarf with the sturdy constitution and almost cuddly presence. Another superior selection from this wonderful species, it requires no pruning to maintain its wide-bottomed form.

### **★ BOSNIAN PINE COLLECTION ★**

Iseli Nursery, through extensive trials over more than two decades, studied *Pinus heldreichii* seedlings. Selections were made for uniquely desirable conformation, color, and other characteristics. The resulting collection of dwarf and slow-growing *Pinus heldreichii* cultivars offers distinct improvements over widely-used, established pine varieties, giving garden centers and landscapers choice options for adding year-round beauty to intimate outdoor living spaces. In fact, these cultivars are so healthy and reliable that they practically grow themselves.

During the selection process, superior seedlings were chosen for well-proportioned size and form, including distinctly narrow spires or fastigiated columns, particularly striking bun or pyramid shapes, and the best traditional, "pine tree" form. But, better form was not the only criteria used for identifying superior trees. All selections also displayed cold hardiness to USDA Zone 5 and possessed upright needles and excellent health, including resistance to insect and disease problems. The resulting collection of superior dwarf and slow-growing Bosnian pine cultivars, which perform best when grown in full sun and well-drained soil, is now available for discerning gardeners.

# Pinus heldreichii 'Compact Gem'

A very slow-growing, narrow tree, 'Compact Gem' is a time-honored treasure for the garden, especially one with limited space. The sturdy Bosnian pine matures into a dense, well-proportioned, columnar tree that stays trim even after many years. Elegant, long, dark green needles cover the tree's branches thickly and contribute to a dynamic, full-size feel that fits in tight garden spaces. Superior disease and pest resistance and outstanding health assure year-round beauty. Originally introduced to the trade in 1964 by Hillier Nursery in England, 'Compact Gem' warrants continued acclaim and wider use in today's tighter garden spaces.

#### Pinus heldreichii 'Emerald Arrow' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 5 Intermediate 15'h x 8'w Green 🔘

Our ongoing efforts to find improved compact conifers resulted in the discovery of this outstanding narrow pine. Upright branches on the tall, trim tree display pairs of elegant, dark green needles accented by silvery white fascicles and bark. 'Emerald Arrow' gives the impression of being a big tree, yet it stays decidedly narrow. Whether used as an individual focal point, paired to mark the entrance to house or garden, or grouped in an informal cluster, this beautiful garden pine scores a bull's eye on the designer's dartboard.

## Pinus heldreichii 'Indigo Eyes' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 5 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Green O

Named for the eye-catching, cobalt blue cones that decorate each shoot tip in spring, this precocious "coner" demands attention and deserves greater use in gardens. From an early age, cones appear up and down every branch, bright blue at first, then gradually softening to brown during summer. Attractive, broadly upright trees develop an open, slightly asymmetrical shape, which affords each tree a unique character that will intrigue gardeners in their outdoor living spaces. #### Pinus heldreichii 'Irish Bell' Iseli®

This sturdy, dwarf Bosnian pine boasts a handsome, broadly pyramidal form that stays compact, neat and well-mannered. Trees gradually widen into a classic bell shape, narrow at the top, broader near the ground and about as wide as tall. A mature 'Irish Bell' displays a colony of upright branches, each one decorated with tufts of straight green needles and glistening white fascicles. The bright white accent gives the impression that light dances among the needles, a feature that accentuates the beauty of this useful ornamental pine and adds to its value as a striking garden specimen. Well regarded in the trade, this selection is a good choice for urban and suburban gardens for year-round impact.

#### Pinus heldreichii 'Mint Truffle' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 5 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green 🔾

Shaped more like a broad teardrop than a gourmet truffle, this highly useful Bosnian pine is nevertheless a wonderful treat. Dense, finely textured, green needles cover every shoot completely, in contrast to some cultivars that reveal bare stems. Characterized by restrained, slow growth, gently incurving branches and a compact, well-proportioned form, 'Mint Truffle' offers gardeners a tasty option for adding year-round beauty to a small garden. Very little needle drop and exceptionally good health, including resistance to disease and pests and tolerance of a variety of conditions, contribute to the value of this unique plant.

#### Pinus heldreichii 'Smidtii'

Globe Shaped Zone 5 Miniature 11/2'h x 11/2'w Green 🔘

One of the nicest of the Bosnian pine cultivars, this choice bush-form miniature deserves a prominent position in a very small space, such as a container or rock garden. A rare, highly desirable cultivar, 'Smidtii' maintains its neat, compact habit without any pruning, shaping or shearing. The extremely small bush with tightly congested, dark green needles, very slow growth and a rugged, durable constitution provides striking beauty and long life in even the smallest spaces. A 100-year-old specimen, discovered in 1926 in the mountains near Sarajevo by Eugen Smidt, had retained its dense, compact character and reached only 10' tall in a century.

# Pinus jeffreyi 'Joppi'

Globe Shaped Zone 5 Intermediate 12'h x 12'w Green © Full puffs of long, narrow needles grace the branches of this small, rounded, Ponderosa-type pine. A seedling selected in 1980 by Pete Vergeldt in the Netherlands, it was named for his oldest son Jop. Much slower and smaller, but with the same 6–8" needles as the immense West Coast native, it is adaptable and provides a big impact in a small, sunny rock garden, container or courtyard. Spring candles show an unexpected lavender color.

#### Pinus koraiensis 'Blue Ball'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 3'h x 3'w Bluish Green 🔾

A dwarf selection of Korean pine with blue green needles that emphasize the blue. Short stiff branches and long needles form a globe shaped plant that has a bit of irregularity to it. Hardy and adaptable, with minimal disease or insect problems, 'Blue Ball' has great potential for a variety of settings.

## Pinus koraiensis 'Silveray'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Large 20'h x 10'w Blue 🔾

Two-tone green and silver needles extend from the bundles in twists and turns, giving an overall silvery appearance. With an upright and slender form, this tidy selection will thrive in full sun and is highly adaptable and durable for many landscapes.

# Pinus longaeva 'Formal Form'

Norrow Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 10'h x 6'w Bluish Green O One of the elegant Great Basin bristlecone pines, this selection has a narrow, uniform shape, larger than the dwarf 'Sherwood Compacta' and smaller than the large 'Blue Heron.' Trees boast clusters of closely held, 1½"

long, green needles in bundles of five that radiate around the ascending branches, giving each the look of a bottlebrush. Formal and long-lived, this slow-growing, bluish tree maintains its form with little or no pruning.

#### Pinus longaeva 'Joe's Bess' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 6'h x 4'w Bluish Green 🔘

An Iseli seedling selection, this gorgeous Great Basin bristlecone pine is possibly the most refined pine we grow. It has a compact, uniform shape, larger than 'Sherwood Compacta,' but smaller than 'Formal Form.' Dense clusters of two-toned needles point towards the tip of each ascending branch and create a consistent shape that hides the stems and buds until new growth emerges in late spring. Jean noted the origin of this beauty as 1975, and conifer great Joe Reis, given the task of naming the tree in 1982, chose to honor his wife Bess. It has proven difficult to propagate, but is worth the wait. This slow-growing tree requires little or no pruning.

### Pinus longaeva 'Sherwood Compacta'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 2'w Green 🔘

This handsome, slow-growing Great Basin bristlecone pine develops a perfectly conical shape and a dense, formal appearance. Tightly packed tufts of medium-long, green needles with white undersides radiate around the ascending branches of the long-lived conifer. Related to the oldest-living known organism, this selection was found and named by late Oregon nurseryman Andy Sherwood.

# Pinus mugo 'Big Tuna' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 2 Intermediate 10'h x 6'w Green 🔘

Boldly textured, medium length needles make this sturdy, upright, multi-stemmed tree a favorite for areas in the landscape with a little more room. The slow-growing trees become taller than wide and quite bushy. Very hardy and uniquely dense, 'Big Tuna' is compact, but not dwarf. 



The naturally variable, windswept character of this choice, slow-growing Japanese white pine makes it a highly desirable addition to the landscape. Its twisted, brush-like clusters of needles appear along spreading branches, some of them exposed to show off gray, textured bark. Gently curved shoots, accented with attractive small cones, provide year-round appeal. Site the accent conifer in a raised, courtyard bed, container or other premium location with full sun and average moisture. Salt tolerance suggests a seaside setting.

# New Pinus parviflora 'Koru'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Bluish Green O This slow growing Japanese white pine cultivar has wide blue green needles that cluster and curl, swirling around branches to create an attractively textured look. Cones frosted with white resin that develop at terminal buds and along the branches add even more interest. While this specimen has the irregular habit typical of the species, it does maintain a conical shape overall. With its relaxing silvery blue color and sculptural form, 'Koru' makes a compelling focal point in the Asian inspired garden. *Limited Availability*

The main branches have some twists and turns to them adding some sculptural quality to the bushy form. Handsome cones are scattered throughout. Has been compared to 'Brevifolia' but smaller in stature.

# Pinus parviflora 'Ogon janome'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Variegated An incredibly beautiful plant, this rare, mid-size, "Dragon's Eye" form of Japanese white pine exhibits tasteful variegation, like yellow bands on the needles. # New Pinus parviflora 'Zigzag' Iseli®

A new Iseli Introduction that has been evaluated for over 20 years; this cultivar of Japanese white pine was originally found as a seedling of the popular cultivar 'Kinpo'. Named 'Zigzag' for its irregular and meandering growth habit, this dwarf conifer maintains a narrow upright habit. Densely clustered green needles are short, straight, and softly textured. Performance will be best when sited in a sunny area with well-drained soil.

### **New Pinus ponderosa**

Broad Upright Zone 4 Large 35'h x 15'w Green 🔾

Ponderosa pine, the iconic tree of the American west, flourishes in a variety of environments, from the slopes of the Rocky Mountains to the western edge of the Great Plains. Its adaptability and hardiness make it a favored choice for those seeking to cultivate a piece of the wild in their own backyard. The bark matures to a rich cinnamon red, developing broad plates separated by deep fissures. The branches are short and well-spaced, with distinctive long, slender needles. Given time, this long-lived tree will exceed heights of more than 40', so be sure to give it room to thrive. Thanks to a deep tap root, the rugged ponderosa pine can withstand summer drought and high winds. The seed for our stock was sourced at high elevation east of the Cascades.

### Pinus pumila 'Blue Dwarf'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 6'w Bluish Green 🔘

This unusual, dwarf Siberian pine was selected for a spring display of carmine red cones that contrast with the superior, blue of the needles. It produces a dense load of twisted needles and a horizontal, spreading habit that is unique among *Pinus pumila* cultivars. Native to extremely cold, exposed regions of northeastern Asia, the tough constitution of this pine stands up to harsh conditions.

### Pinus resinosa 'Morel' Iseli®

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Intermediate 10'h x 10'w Green O

A new, compact, bush form of the American red pine, 'Morel' has long, light green needles that are soft to the touch. Mid-size plants become dense, billowy shrubs that resemble the shape of morel mushrooms with rounded top-caps and more height than width. The very hardy plants project an informal beauty in the garden year-round.

### Pinus strobus 'Angel Falls' Iseli®

Weeping Zone 3 Large Size Defined by Culture Green 🔘

This selection of *Pinus strobus* 'Pendula' (Weeping White Pine) demonstrated its refined characteristics early in the evaluation process at Iseli Nursery. Started from seed in 1981, the slow-growing tree has very long, very narrow, light green needles and a strong weeping habit. Its closely held branches develop graceful draping forms that combine a tall, narrow stature with a broad, flowing skirt. Named for the world's tallest waterfall after 20 years of evaluation, the unique tree offers elegance and style.

### Pinus strobus 'Blue Shag'

Globe Shaped Zone 3 Dwarf 6'h x 6'w Bluish Green 🔘

This sprightly dwarf cultivar of eastern white pine produces long, soft, blue-green foliage and an outstanding, compact, reliably rounded form. Its size, shape, color and texture make the seedling, grown and selected by Sydney Waxman, University of Connecticut, an excellent addition to many landscapes.

### Pinus strobus 'Ground Hugger'

Spreading Zone 3 Intermediate 6'h x 10'w Green O

Characteristic thin, two-tone needles cover this spreading eastern white pine. The blue-green foliage brightens the ground as it fills out with age. Thin cones that are 4-5 inches in length and covered with white pitch appear at a young age. As with any strobus, avoid soils with poor drainage.

### Pinus strobus 'Macopin'

Broad Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Bluish Green C Exuberant cone production, even when young, distinguishes this specimen from other white pine cultivars. The mid-size tree develops an open, irregular habit and broad branches with soft, blue-green foliage. Originated as a witch's broom found by Wm. Gotelli and George Erhle at Macopin, New Jersey.

#### Pinus strobus 'Mini Twists'



A great fit for the smaller landscape, this Greg Williams selection of the eastern white pine with its small twisted and curvy needles will create an unusual texture in the garden. A much smaller, dwarf version of the large growing *Pinus strobus* 'Contorta,' 'Mini Twists' responds well to annual candle pruning which will encourage an even more compact, full-foliaged small tree.

### Pinus strobus 'Niagara Falls'

This handsome, cascading white pine was found as a sport of 'Pendula' and demonstrates a distinct improvement over that familiar landscape tree. The compact, weeping form boasts many draping branches and long, two-tone needles. Every dense, wide specimen develops a unique character and flowing habit that mimics the action of a roaring Niagara Falls. Found by Mike and Ken Yeager of Hickory Hollow Nursery in New York in 1998 while working on a landscape job, this is a distinctive specimen for the discerning client.

Long, slender, feathery, blue-green needles clothe a very narrow upright tree. Much improved over 'Fastigiata', the tight branching makes it resistant to snow damage. This sturdy tree was found by Greg Williams near the Stowe Mountain Ski Resort, Vermont.

### Pinus sylvestris 'Albyn Prostrata'

Prostrate Zone 3 Intermediate 2'h x 10'w Green 🔘

This vigorous spreader is an excellent groundcover that spills over banks and rambles through garden beds. With maturity, layered branches mound in the center and taper down to the edges. A blue cast adds interest to the thick, green needles of this seedling selection from Albyn Nursery, Newark, Ohio.

### Podocarpus lawrencei 'Blue Gem'

Globe Shaped Zone 6 Dwarf 4'h x 6'w Bluish Green 👄

This shrub-like conifer, the mountain plum pine from Tasmania, is both hardy and exotic. It has thick, blunt foliage like that of a conifer, but instead of cones, it produces lush, red "mountain plums." Arching branches create a rounded, spreading form, and spring growth emerges purple-red, then matures to green, a color that holds through winter. The adaptable, easy plant is an excellent candidate for drier garden sites.

#### Podocarpus nivalis 'Jalako Red'

### Podocarpus x 'Red Tip'

In late summer, the short, thin, yew-like foliage of this tiny, slow-growing *Podocarpus* puts on a flush of deep red that holds through winter. The rest of the year, rich, deep green foliage spirals up the plant's short stems. The smallest *Podocarpus* available from Iseli Nursery, it makes a charming, spreading addition to smaller, warmer, drier sites.

# **PODOCARPUS**

The genus *Podocarpus* (plum pine or yew pine) traces its origins to mountain forests in warm, temperate regions. Known to be excellent woody shrubs, *Podocarpus* plants are very useful in dry

parts of the garden in full sun or part shade, where they demonstrate good drought tolerance. We offer unusual dwarf, spreading cultivars, chosen for unique colors and, in one case, extended hardiness. These cultivars with wide, flat needles grow slowly into low, mounded shrubs that are amenable to pruning.

Others in the genus are amazing — and amusing — pendulous trees, those Dr. Seuss types that grow into unique botanic sculptures. #### Stewartia koreana

Branching that begins low on the trunk contributes to its pyramidal form, and the fall color is a flaming burgundy red. This tree prefers light shade in hot and humid areas and moist, well-draining, acidic soil.

### **STEWARTIA**

An excellent choice for dramatic understory interest, these delicate trees deserve a starring role in the landscape. They show off camellia-like flowers in early summer, outstanding color in fall, and gorgeous, peeling bark on distinctive branches in winter. Treat them well with part shade and moist, acid soil that is high in organic matter.

#### Taxodium distichum 'Peve Mingret'

Narrow Upright Zone 5 Intermediate 10'h x 6'w Green 👄

This naturally dwarf tree, selected in the Netherlands by Pete Vergeldt, is an introduction with immense horticultural value. The dense, compact spire has soft, rich-green foliage that begs to be touched. In autumn, the fine, almost feathery needles change to red-brown and hold for weeks. In winter, beautifully tiered branches that point up at the tips give the small tree added elegance and character. The deciduous conifer can be kept small and narrow with hard late-winter pruning, if desired. Widely adaptable for both northern cold and southern hot areas.

### **TAXODIUM**

Members of the genus *Taxodium*, the bald and pond cypress are deciduous conifers that thrive in very wet places, including swamps. Finely textured needles change from green to rich russet in fall, and then drop, showing off striking bark and round leathery cones. The cultivars we offer, chosen for appealing color, growth rate and form, are tough plants that work in virtually any type of soil, except alkaline. Although denizens of the swamp, these selections also grow well in areas that aren't soggy, and they perform as beautiful ornamental landscape features, given adequate moisture.

The slender habit makes it a good choice for tight garden spaces needing a spot of color. Typical of the species, it is tolerant of many soil types, preferring moist, well-drained sandy loam in sun or shade.

### Taxus baccata 'Fastigiata Micro'

Rich, dark green needles cover this extremely narrow dwarf pillar. Bright green new growth contrasts sharply against the mature needles that are a dark glossy green on top and a paler green underneath. Characteristic of the English yew, the needles are spirally arranged around the shoots. Small berry-like fruit are a bonus attraction to this plant that grows wider than tall. Does well in shade so it is a perfect understory plant.

### Taxus cuspidata 'Amersfoort'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Dwarf 6'h x 4'w Green 👄

'Amersfoort' produces short, flat, oval needles that are unusual for a yew. It develops stiff, dark green, outward-spreading branches that form an attractive, slow-growing shrub. Adds an interesting texture to the collector's garden.

### Taxus cuspidata 'Dwarf Bright Gold'

This bright canary yellow ball is an element that can't be overlooked when taking a stroll through the garden or looking from afar. The uniform, upright, fan-like foliage produces a dense and tidy globe. Can be used planted in a row to make a stunningly colorful border or for individual color spots throughout the landscape.

### Thuja occidentalis 'DeGroot's Spire'

Narrow Upright Zone 3 Intermediate 15'h x 3'w Green O

This American arborvitae has it all: habit, color and texture. It combines a narrow, columnar form with thick, ruffled, medium green foliage and branchlets that occasionally twist and layer over one another. Use the seedling selection from Sheridan Nursery, Ontario, Canada as a single explanation point, in a grouping or lined up for tall screening in tight spaces. Thuja occidentalis, known as arborvitae or "tree of life," and Thuja plicata, the western red cedar, are hardy, durable and adaptable conifer species that develop great natural variation, resulting in many new and exciting cultivars. These minimal-maintenance plants, available in many colors, shapes and growth rates, perform well in a variety of garden situations, from screens and hedging to distinctive

focal points. Both species tolerate some shade and a wide range of soil types, and *T. plicata* shows some resistance to deer.

### Thuja plicata 'Virescens'

This upright western red cedar becomes a tall, tight, pyramid with up-reaching branches and a slightly narrower habit than the species. Its dark green foliage, which stays green all year, is so glossy that it seems to glisten. Trees prefer moist, well-drained soil in full or partial sun. Some deer resistance.

### Thuja plicata 'Whipcord'

### New Thujopsis dolabrata var. hondae

The variety of common names this species goes by (Hiba arborvitae, elkhorn cedar, and lizard tree) speaks to the fascination its distinctive foliage inspires. Flattened fernlike branchlets are clad in shiny green, thick scale-like leaves, each of which has a curved shape like an antler and is marked with thick white stomatal bands on the reverse. ### Tsuga canadensis 'Albospica'

An outstanding, underutilized hemlock, this spreading cultivar has stiff main branches that knuckle under and bend downwards to create a truly prostrate form. Gnarly interior branches show off the plant's silver bark, which adds dimension to the exceptional, low plant. Use the garden gem to drape over or around stones or walls in a site with partial shade.

### Tsuga canadensis 'Dawsoniana'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green Extremely attractive tufts of short, bright green needles give the gracefully arching shoots of this compact, multi-stemmed plant a dense look. Selected by Jackson Dawson at the Hunnewell Arboretum in 1927, it grows slowly, but attains a full, bushy form. Among the most attractive of the wide-leafed cultivars.

#### Tsuga canadensis 'Forest Fountain'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Green

A small, pyramidal tree with deep green foliage, this selection has branches that arch upward in the shape of a fountain. Plant the extraordinary sculptural plant as a focal point or as part of an informal grouping. Found by John Mitsch, Aurora, Oregon.

### Tsuga canadensis 'Golden Splendor'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Large 25'h x 15'w Yellow

This graceful, elegant, fast-growing Canadian hemlock resembles the species in all but color: this one, introduced by John Mitsch, Aurora, Oregon, is golden. Unlike other golden cultivars, it tolerates full sun and produces brighter color with more exposure. 'Golden Splendor' makes a dramatic specimen tree or it can be sheared into a golden hedge.

## Tsuga canadensis 'Gracilis'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 1½'h x 3'w Green 👄

The spreading shoots of this low hemlock produce a broad, flat-top effect, so it makes a good understory addition to mixed borders. Densely packed, bright, new needles erupt on the slow-growing, uniform plant in spring. Often improperly called 'Gracilis Nana' or 'Nana Gracilis.'

### Tsuga canadensis 'Green Lace'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 8'h x 6'w Green

Tiny green needles are held close and are widely spaced along thin tan stems. The open airy habit gives the impression of delicate lacework. Works well when used as a backdrop in a smaller space as the texture doesn't overpower other plant material. Wherever it calls home, be sure to provide moist, well-drained soil and a bit of shade from scorching summer sun. *Limited Availability*

### Tsuga canadensis 'Hebefolia'

Tiny gray-green needles are wide and rounded, looking more like leaves and resembling those of the Hebe genus. Green on top, the needles are held very close to the stems so that the white undersides are very exposed. With such short needles lots of stem is exposed for a twiggy look. # Tsuga canadensis 'Jeddeloh'

Spreading Zone 4 Dwarf 2'h x 4'w Green 👄

A dwarf, spreading mound, often referred to as Bird's Nest Hemlock, this seedling cultivar has a unique, depressed, funnel shape at its center. The slow-growing plant has bright green foliage with feathery, arching tips. Discovered by Jeddeloh Nursery in a cemetery in Germany in 1950.

#### Tsuga canadensis 'Jervis'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dwarf 3'h x 2'w Green 👄

Dense branching, a broad, pyramidal form and congested, dark green foliage are similar to, but more compact than 'Hussi.' Plants grow slowly into irregular, upright forms with prominent buds and short, twiggy growth.

### Tsuga canadensis 'Moon Frost'

Globe Shaped Zone 4 Dwarf 6'h x 6'w Variegated

Bright, white, new growth with older, inner foliage that retains a light tone combine to give this plant a distinctly white appearance. In winter, foliage of the seedling, developed by Ed Wood, takes on a blush of pink. A compact globe when young, 'Moon Frost' broadens and increases its growth rate with age, but remains a reliably small, dwarf plant.

### Tsuga canadensis 'Pendula'

Weeping Zone 4 Large Size Defined by Culture Green 👄 The popular weeping form of Canadian hemlock is widely known and used, especially when it is staked and trained to develop height and character. Pendulous branches form a thick exterior "shell" of foliage that covers the plant's interior structural scaffold.

### Tsuga canadensis 'Summer Snow'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Variegated The new spring growth of this cultivar is white, which produces a striking contrast against the dark green interior foliage on the fast-growing, upright, broad plant. Its size, shape and colorful growth make it an extremely useful highlight for shade gardens. Originally propagated by John Mitsch, Aurora, Oregon.

### Tsuga chinensis

Broad Upright Zone 6 Intermediate 20'h x 15'w Green Chinese hemlock is a graceful ornamental alternative to the native eastern hemlock that is highly resistant to the hemlock wooly adelgid, which has devastated the native hemlock population in this part of the United States. This conical tree has ascending branches with elegantly drooping branchlets, which are ornamented with petite cones in fall. A fine choice for hedging material in pest infested areas. Our selection is from a plant at the Morris Arboretum in Pennsylvania that was planted in 1948. Limited Availability

### Tsuga diversifolia 'Loowit'

Globe Shaped Zone 4 Dwarf 2'h x 2'w Green

Small, blunt needles look like green grains of rice interspersed with tiny brown buds. Diminutive branches crowded with branchlets form a tight, congested bun. This dwarf hemlock was selected from seed collected in the high alpine region of Fukushima prefecture, Japan. It was given the Native American name for Mt. St. Helens, Iseli Nursery's famous volcanic neighbor.

### Tsuga diversifolia 'Minikin'

Broad Upright Zone 4 Dworf 6'h x 4'w Green Small, wide, blunt-tipped needles sit at different angles along the shoots, occasionally exposing the silver undersides, and giving a fully clothed appearance to the plant. Globe shaped when young, it becomes more vigorous and oval shaped with age.

#### Tsuga heterophylla 'Iron Springs'

Broad Upright Zone 6 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green Short, dark green needles contrast well with the light bark on the very irregular branches of this choice selection of western hemlock. It eventually develops a rigid, upright-broad habit, but it grows more slowly than the species. Found at Iron Springs, Washington, and introduced by the University of Washington.

### Tsuga heterophylla 'Thorsen's Weeping'

Weeping Zone 6 Dworf Size Defined by Culture Green Arch, emerald-green foliage is arranged densely on the procumbent branches of this extraordinary small hemlock. When staked, the plant becomes a narrow, upright form with sweeping secondary branches that produce a full, soft look. It is strikingly beautiful both as a cascading form and as a groundcover, allowed to ramble through the understory.

#### **New Tsuga mertensiana**

Broad Upright Zone 4 Intermediate 12'h x 8'w Green 🤝

Native to mountains along the Pacific coast from Alaska to central California, the mountain hemlock is an elegant species with stout branches densely clothed with gray green, radially arranged needles. The slow-growing small tree lends a mountain flavor to garden settings. Try a drift of several to create a striking alpine scene or site a specimen to make a handsome focal point.

### Tsuga mertensiana 'Elizabeth'

Spreading Zone 5 Dwarf 3'h x 6'w Bluish Green 👄

The sturdy, horizontal branches of this spreading mountain hemlock reach out and stay close to the ground. Soft, short, radially-arranged, blue-green needles, create a bottlebrush look. An unusual low profile (roughly three times wider than tall) and striking year-round color make it very desirable. Site it on a bank near water or in an alpine garden. Native to mountains along the Pacific coast, plants prefer plenty of moisture, excellent drainage and protection from hot, dry conditions.

### Tsuga mertensiana 'Glacier Peak' Iseli®

Broad Upright Zone 5 Intermediate 10'h x 8'w Bluish Green

This seedling selection of mountain hemlock is the choice for gardeners who want a garden sized tree with an alpine appearance. The short, blue-green needles have a silvery cast and grow all around the stems giving a tufty appearance. 'Glacier Peak' provides a consistent upright tree form while still keeping the irregular rugged look of the mertensiana seedlings. Thrives in highly organic, moist, well-drained soil and tolerates partial shade. *Limited Availability*

#### Ulmus parvifolia 'Hokkaido'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Small Broadleaf 1'h x 1'w Green 🔘

Everything about this Chinese elm is tiny: tiny leaves cover tiny twigs and create a full size plant of tiny dimensions. Naturally congested growth and a stocky trunk give the small tree the appearance of age, a quality valued in miniature landscapes, railroad gardens and bonsai. The plant develops thick, corky bark with age. Site it in full to part sun with moist, well-drained soil. Don't overwater in winter, and don't let it dry out or scorch in intense summer sun. #### Ulmus parvifolia 'Seiju'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Small Broadleaf 4'h x 4'w Green Even in winter, without leaves, this dwarf Chinese elm has a fascinating look. Buds along the plant's many short, twiggy shoots look like strands of jewels, as do the green leaves when they emerge. Older stems develop exfoliating bark. Use the small, slow-growing, high-interest plant in rock garden, container or small bed to provide an Asian aesthetic. Prefers full to part sun and moist, well-drained soil.

#### *Ulmus* x *hollandica* 'Jacqueline Hillier'

Broad Upright Zone 5 Small Broadleaf 4'h x 4'w Green 🔘

A unique, slow-growing, dwarf elm found in a garden in Birmingham, England, this beautiful selection has elegant, dense branching that forms a canopy. Typical of elm trees, it has an aggressive root system and will thrive in any soil type and in exposed positions. It is excellent in the garden or a container. The leaves are mini-versions of those of the gigantic, standard elm, which gives the small tree an advantage, as a bonsai specimen, in imitating an ancient tree.

### **ULMUS**

We offer one species and a hybrid of elm. *Ulmus parvifolia*, the Chinese elm, has flaking bark that is mottled with tans and reds, hence the reason it is sometimes known as Lacebark elm. *Ulmus x hollandica*, or Dutch elm, is a naturally occurring hybrid of *Ulmus minor* and *Ulmus glabra*. Elms are adaptable to many soils but thrive in a fertile, moist environment.

A unique cultivar which twines clockwise and blooms early in mild climates. May be of hybrid origin with some mixture of *Wisteria floribunda*, which would account for the twining direction and early bloom. The blue-violet flower clusters can be tinged mauve and will produce an extraordinary profusion of bloom on older plants. This plant also boasts showy, large, velvety seed pods and a soft yellow fall color.

#### Wisteria brachybotrys 'Shiro Kapitan'

Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture White Flower 👄

This first rate garden plant is rare outside of Japan. The strongly and sweetly scented white blooms are superior in color to white cultivars of *Wisteria sinensis* and will bloom before the white form of *Wisteria floribunda*. The foliage is a pale golden green when young, sometimes tinted bronze.

#### **WISTERIA**

We grow two different species of Japanese wisteria. Wisteria floribunda is acclaimed for producing extremely long, romantic racemes. Wisteria brachybotrys, or the silky wisteria, is characterized by short, broad racemes and downy leaves. Our cultivars are excellent garden plants that will cloak a sturdy arbor, even at an early age, with beauty spring through fall. Fragrant blooms decorate the spring scene, then give way to ornamental pods in summer, and turn colorful in fall. Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture Purple Flower 🔘

Named for opera singer Jessye Norman, this gorgeous garden diva is adorned in fragrant splendor in spring with racemes loaded with bright purple, double flowers. Plant her near a window so that her perfume will waft inside on the breeze or let this vigorous grower ramble over an arbor or pergola to shade an outdoor gathering area. A full sun location is the key to abundant blooms.

#### Wisteria floribunda 'Honbeni'

Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture Pink Flower 👄

A vigorous, flowering vine, this selection of deciduous Japanese wisteria produces soft pink racemes that are tinged with lavender and lightly scented. Since the vine grows more slowly than other cultivars, it makes a good choice for smaller gardens or arbors, where the beautiful 13–16" flower clusters (occasionally up to 18") put on a long show. New growth is bronze, summer color is deep green and in autumn, the pinnate leaves turn yellow. Train and prune with care for reliable bloom. Also known as 'Pink Ice.' *Limited Availability* 

#### Wisteria floribunda 'Lawrence'

Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture Purple Flower

This variety was discovered growing in Ottawa, Canada in the early 1970's. A fast growing vine with dark green leaves, 'Lawrence' is acknowledged by many as the top lavender-blue cultivar with more flowers per raceme than any other *floribunda*. The attractive lightly scented flowers are clustered on 12–18" long racemes.

#### Wisteria floribunda 'Longissima Alba' (Shiro Noda)

#### Wisteria floribunda 'Macrobotrys'

Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture Purple Flower 👄

One of the world's great garden plants, this sturdy ornamental vine is often seen in photographs with lovely, very fragrant flowers cascading off ornamental bridges in Japan. The exceptionally long racemes are 2–4' long bearing 80 to 125 well spaced pale violet flowers with a yellow blotch. Each leaf holds 11–17 pale bronze leaflets in spring which turn clear yellow in fall. Vigorous growth needs to be trained for the first 3 years to get established then requires an annual spring pruning after flowering.

#### Wisteria floribunda 'Royal Purple'

Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture Purple Flower

A vigorous growing vine with spectacular purple and white, single flowers in spring. The flowers form in long racemes, from 12–24" long, making a stunning display when trained over an arbor or along the edge of a covered patio. Hardy to Zone 5, 'Royal Purple' can be cultured to cover a long distance or pruned heavily into a tree-like form. A versatile vine with a spectacular color display in spring.

#### Wisteria floribunda 'Violacaea plena'

Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture Purple Flower Spectacular double violet flowers fade to whitish lavender on 12–18" racemes. The flowers begin their show midway through spring and continue for several weeks. Useful planted on the garden trellis, trained along a fence, on an arbor or gazebo. This vigorous vine will grasp any nearby structure and soften its edges with green foliage after the spring show is complete.

#### New Wisteria macrostachya 'Blue Moon'

Vine Zone 4 Size Defined by Culture Blue Flower Sometimes known as the Kentucky Wisteria, this hardy deciduous vine has foot long racemes of fragrant, lavender-blue flowers. A less aggressive grower than other wisteria, it is noted for producing flowers in Zone 4 and blooms multiple times during the season. Tolerant of wet soils, the species is found along swamps from Louisiana to Illinois.

#### New Wisteria x Grande Diva® Barbara 'MinwikKB25'

Vine Zone 5 Size Defined by Culture Purple Flower 🔘

This hybrid wisteria was originally propagated at Minier Nursery in France and was named in honor of the world-famous opera singer Barbara Hendrix. Barbara is a generous blooming hybrid wisteria that creates an exceptional cascade of two-tone lavender and white flowers in spring. As common with most wisteria, this vigorous climbing vine needs to be trained along a rigid support structure, like an arbor, trellis, or pergola.

#### Adiantum pedatum

Five Finger Maidenhair Fern Spreading Zone 3 Deciduous 1-3'

The very popular native North American fern has unique green frond "hands" with airy horizontal "fingers" atop purple-black stems. Although deciduous, fronds can hold into late fall if the season is long. Avoid full sun.

#### Adiantum pedatum (aleucitum) 'Imbricatum'

Northern Maidenhair Fern Spreading Zone 3 Deciduous 8-12"

Green finger-like fronds contrast boldy against thin black stems on this deciduous fern. The pinnules are straight edged on one side, curved and slightly ruffled offering a distinctive look. Grows best in well-drained, moisture retentive soil and is reportedly deer resistant.

#### Adiantum venustum

Himalayan Maidenhair Fern Spreading Zone 6 Evergreen 12-15"

Unlike most hardy maidenhairs, this one is evergreen. Early spring growth is tinged a salmon rose color, tolerating late frosts. This spreading groundcover creeps along a lightly shaded understory but is not invasive.

#### Adiantum x mairisii

Clumping Zone 7 Deciduous 15-18"

The lacy, bright green fronds have blackish stipes. Although deciduous, it holds its fronds well into autumn. It enjoys moist soil and bright to filtered shade. This hybrid is hardier than one would suspect.

#### **New Asplenium ebenoides**

Dragon's Tail Fern

Spreading Zone 4 Evergreen 8-12"

Commonly referred to as the dragon's tail fern, it is a natural hybrid fern that slowly grows into a low mound of narrow, triangular fronds with many fingers along the midrib. A hardy evergreen perennial that is best suited in a rock or woodlands garden. Consider also for indoor terrariums. Prefers cool, moist locations.

#### Asplenium trichomanes

Maidenhair Spleenwort Crown Zone 5 Evergreen 4–8"

A dainty miniature fern with pairs of small rounded leaves along the stems. Naked older fronds build up a tuft underneath the current year's growth. Unpopular with slugs, it enjoys filtered shade.

#### Athyrium filix-femina 'Victoriae'

Victoria Lady Fern

Clumping Zone 4 Deciduous 18-24"

Unusual with a capital U. Pinnae criss-cross each other to form a row of X's along the frond. The crested tip has drooping tassels of split tips. Tolerates drier soils but requires light to full shade.

#### Athyrium niponicum 'Godzilla'

Godzilla Japanese Painted Fern Clumping Zone 5 Deciduous 30-36"

As the name implies, 'Godzilla' is a giant version of the Japanese painted fern. Arching clumps of silver fronds with green highlights and purple stems reach a length of 3 feet and spread to a space 4-6' wide. Enjoys rich moist soil in partial or full shade. Trim old fronds back when new ones are 6" tall.

#### Athyrium niponicum 'Pictum Regal Red'

Regal Red Japanese Painted Fern

Clumping Zone 5 Deciduous 8-20"

Silvery green foliage with rich red stems and veins give this fern beautiful color to complement other garden plants in rich, moist soil and open shade. Holds its fronds into late autumn.

#### Athyrium otophorum var. okanum

Okanum Eared Lady Fern

Clumping Zone 5 Semi-Evergreen 18-24"

Deep burgundy stems and veins contrast with lime green leaves that mature to an unusual gray green, giving this fern a unique, almost ethereal effect. Spreading Zone 5 Evergreen 18-24"

Partial and fully shaded sites become brilliant in the spring with bright orange-red fronds that hold their color well into the summer before turning a shiny green. Drought tolerant once established.

'Congestum' forms a small feathery mound that's both deer and rabbit resistant. A bit deceiving, the divided lobes are held so tight that they don't appear to be divided until closely examined. It is very clumped with dense clusters of foliage that accent rock gardens or woodland edges.

#### New Polystichum setiferum 'Herrenhausen'

Herrenhausen Soft Shield Fern

Crown Zone 6 Evergreen 2-3'

'Herrenhausen' forms a lacy rosette of divided fronds that are widest in the middle. The russet colored scales and bulbils along the stalks provide lots of interest. Clump forming, it enjoys part to full shade and is drought tolerant. The shady rock garden is a perfect site.

#### New Polystichum setiferum 'Plumoso Densum'

Crested Soft Shield Fern

Crown Zone 6 Evergreen 10-12"

Beautiful feathery fronds are quadra-pinnate, meaning the pinnae are divided, then divided again. 'Plumoso Densum' has very lacy and feathery fronds that overlap in a horizontal fashion and whorl around the stem. Enjoys moist, lightly shaded environments and is well suited for covering slopes. In spring, cut back tattered foliage to flaunt the new growth.

#### Woodwardia fimbriata

Giant Chain Fern

Clumping Zone 8 Evergreen 4-8'

Becomes a towering focal point in landscapes with its green, 8' tall fronds. Spore containing clusters, or sori, are visible on the upper surface of the frond. Drought tolerant once established.

#### Woodwardia unigemmata

Jeweled Chain Fern

Clumping Zone 8 Evergreen 3-6'

Young, bright red glossy fronds mature to green as they arch up and downward in a cascade of color. Bulbils form at the tip of each frond, planting themselves as they droop down and reach the ground.







## ORDERING and PLANT CARE



### **Price List and Availabilities**

During the year, we regularly publish current price and availability lists to provide you with accurate updated information on our inventory. We can fax or email these updates to you upon request. Please use this descriptive catalog as an educational sales tool.

#### **Prices**

All published prices are for the trade only and cancel all previously offered prices. All prices are U.S. dollars, FOB our loading dock in Boring, Oregon. Prices may change without prior approval.

#### **Terms**

Cash. We are strictly wholesale. Every reseller in a sales tax jurisdiction needs to provide the appropriate resale certificate and copy of their business license.

On approved credit, payments for shipments are due and payable 30 days from date of invoice. Interest is charged at 2% per month (24% annually) on past due accounts.

Except those making prepayment, resellers must fill out and sign a confidential credit application form. A minimum of three weeks should be allowed to complete the credit determination process.

Cash or interbank transfer received 15 days prior to shipment earns a 2% discount. Credit Card payments made after invoicing are subject to a 2% bank fee.

## **Conflicting Terms**

Seller is not bound by any terms on buyer's order blanks which attempt to impose any conditions at variance with seller's terms and conditions of sale which are included herein or stated on seller's packages, invoices and technical data sheets. Seller's failure to object to provisions contained in the aforementioned forms shall not be deemed a waiver of the provisions of the seller's terms and conditions which shall constitute the entire contract between the parties.

### **Tagging**

We permit limited tagging of material. Contact your salesperson for an explanation of this policy.

### **Tie-off and Confirmations**

Each fall, we consolidate and review all orders before confirming orders for the following spring. We endeavor to provide a fair allocation of material, and we are especially conscious of longtime customers who have previously taken broad product orders, have honored their commitments and have kept their accounts current. We process orders submitted after fall on a first-come, first- served basis.

#### **Cancellations**

Late cancellations are strongly discouraged. We reward customers who honor their commitments by providing the best possible future confirmations.

### **Cultural Practices**

We prune and shear plants when it is appropriate to do so, regardless of shipping considerations. During propagation, we reserve the right to take scion wood from saleable plants, a practice which generally leads to higher quality plants.

## **Plant Care**

In our experience, plants require special care after shipping, so we offer the following recommendations to help maintain plant quality:

### Watering

Water plants as soon as they are unloaded. Thoroughly wet the container media to ensure leaching of excess fertilizer salts. Since fertilizer prills may be dislodged during shipping, rinse the foliage as you water to prevent fertilizer burn. Monitor watering needs daily, especially during dry weather and before expected freezes. Water thoroughly before and after a freeze to help prevent desiccation and ensure that moisture is readily available when the roots thaw.

## **Shading**

In areas of high light intensity or heat, temporarily shade plants until they acclimate to your area.



## SHIPPING and CLAIMS



### **SHIPPING**

Careful shipping promotes safe arrival of your plants and reduces freight cost per plant. Review your order with your sales representative to ensure that freight dollars are spent effectively. He/she can help determine the minimum stacking or wall requirements for shipping general nursery stock, which is not boxed, and liners, which are shipped in cardboard boxes.

In general, ordering specimen material also requires packing of smaller material to use truck space efficiently and achieve a cost-effective load. This is especially true with material like maples, which can be damaged if stacked. Interstacking with smaller material can significantly reduce freight cost per plant. A good practice is to include an open-ended filler in your order to fill empty space on the load. Your salesperson is experienced in this area and will be happy to help.

All shipments travel at the risk and cost of the purchaser. We invoice freight charges separately from plant material charges. Freight charges are due within 10 days of invoicing on all non-COD freight shipments. We request a minimum of 48 hours notice for all shipping and/or pickup.

#### **CLAIMS**

Our responsibility for plant material ends when the stock is delivered to the carrier. Iseli Nursery is not responsible for freight damage or shortages. Temperature recorders are included in most trailers for customer protection.

Claims must be made within 5 days of receipt of shipment. All unsatisfactory goods must be held for our advice or disposition. Any freight claims (material damaged in transit or shortages) must be reported on the Bill of Lading and submitted to the carrier, with a copy submitted immediately to Iseli Nursery. Liability in all instances is limited to the purchase price.

#### No Guarantee

No warranties extend beyond the descriptions in this catalog and we provide no expressed or implied warranties of merchantability. Any plants purchased from us are healthy; however, after they are loaded for shipment, we have no control over what happens to them. Therefore, we do not guarantee plants.

**CONIFERS** – Our plant listings for dwarf conifers include the growth rate standards adopted by The American Conifer Society. This system recognizes that growth rates are affected by climate, moisture, soil type and geographical location.

**BROADLEAF SHRUBS** – The demand for intriguing, unique and unusual broadleaf plants continues to grow. A number of genera have been included in our product line.
